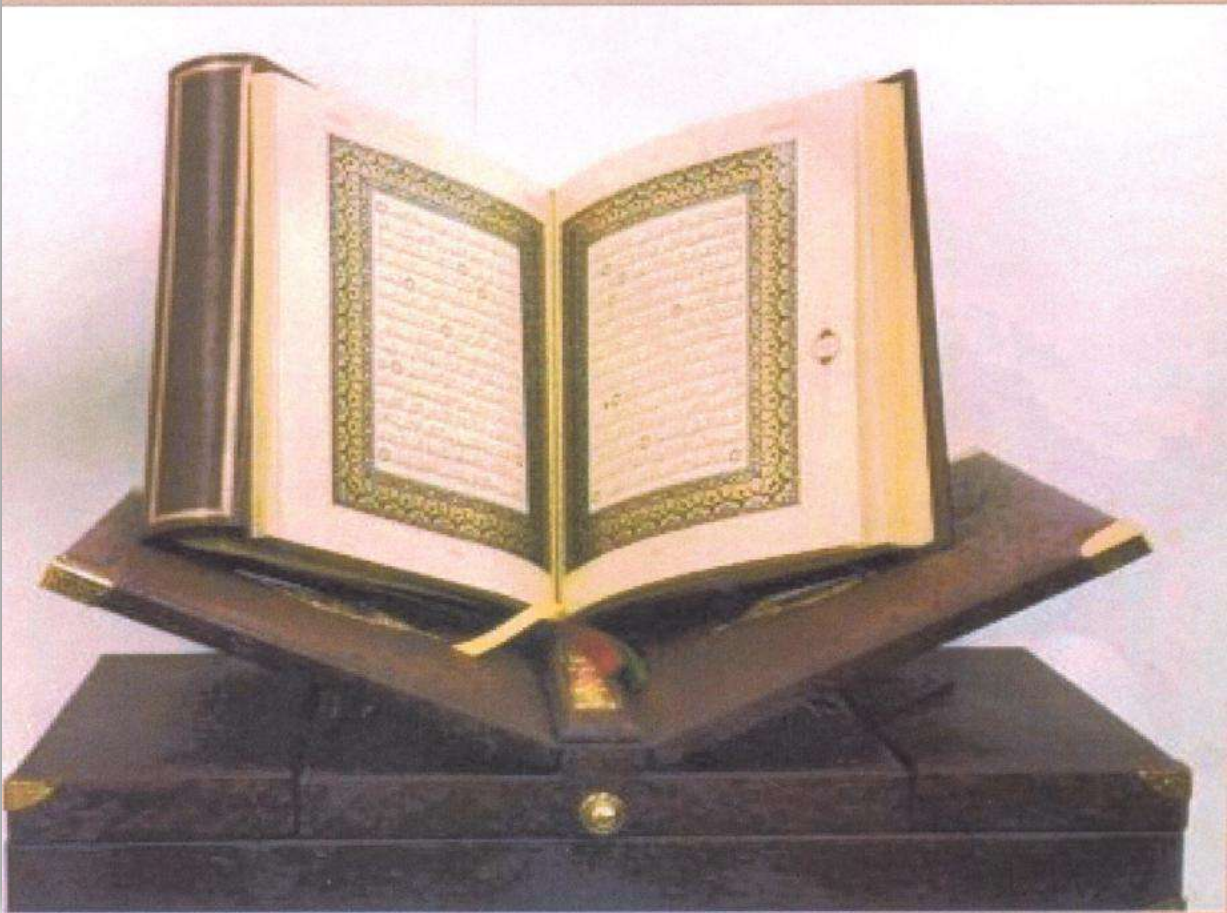

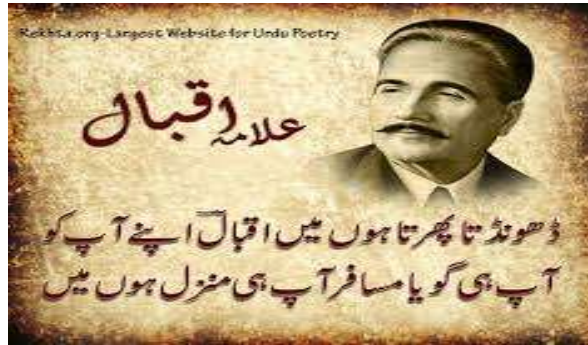

FOREWORD

Transparency is one of the major components of good governance. The periodical reporting of performance of public sector organizations and institutions is considered a step towards transparency. The KPJA being a public sector organization presents its performance annually as a statutory responsibility. This report would reveal that how this institution utilizes the resources and whether the efforts of the Academy are in the right direction towards the achievement of the objectives for which this Academy has been established.

This was a unique year. On the one hand, Hon`ble the Chairman Chief Justice Mazhar Alam Khan Miankhel on his elevation as Judge Supreme Court of Pakistan left us on the second last day of the year i.e. on 30th December 2016, while on the other hand, Hon`ble the Vice Chairman Justice Yahya Afridi, after being appointed as the Chief Justice of Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, assumed charge of the Academy as the Chairman. Thus, there is amalgamation of farewell and welcome sentiments. It reminds me of the vision of our National poet Hazrat Allama Iqbal;’



This message of Iqbal was put to Western audience by the 18th Century American poet Emerson as “Life is a journey, not a destination.”

The phrases ‘Judicial’ and ‘legal’, in terms of education, are usually confused and often used interchangeably. For an effective and efficient dispensation of justice, continuing legal education is a *sine qua non* for judges and lawyers. It is rather more important for them as compared to the gaining knowledge and expertise in other professional disciplines. In a bid to institutionalize judicial education, the Academy has, on the one hand, drawn up *General Training Program (Annex-A)* and has chalked out an extensive *Annual Judicial Calendar* on the other (**Annex-B**), for regular sessions of trainings, workshops and conferences.

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy had indeed a fruitful year. The highlights of the year include the continued capacity building of the justice sector, reflected in an array of trainings imparted by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy. During 2016, all the targets were achieved in shape of 32 trainings/workshops that include post-promotion probation trainings for Senior Civil Judges, Additional District & Sessions Judges and District & Sessions Judges. The Academy has been able to successfully impart first ever four weeks pre-service training for newly appointed Additional District & Sessions Judges. Similarly, all necessary arrangements have been made for the forthcoming training of 101 recently inducted Civil Judges-cum-Judicial Magistrates. It has commenced from 3rd January 2017 and shall be concluded in three batches by 31st March 2017.

The participants of all the trainings represented diverse spectrum associated with the administration of law. They were imparted skills and updated knowledge of laws. The Academy has also inculcated and developed in them the qualities of a good Judge so that they can face the challenges of day-to-day judicial work. It was felt that such a conditioning would optimize the inherent qualities of an individual Judge, so that he may be in a position to play his designated role effectively and efficiently. The Academy, in accordance with its aims and objectives, also imparted training to court personnel and personnel of other departments connected with the administration of justice, such as Public Prosecutors, Government Pleaders, Probation Officers, Police Investigators and many more.

Besides, the Academy has been able to make considerable savings. Thus, the endowment fund which started with Fifty (50) million would be reaching to 105 million by March 2017.

Finally, I would like to thank Mr. Justice Mazhar Alam Khan Miankhel, the Worthy former Chairman of the Academy, Mr. Justice Yahya Afridi, Worthy Chief Justice/ Chairman, Directors of Faculty at KPJA, officers and staff, for their continued support in carrying forward the vision and mission of the Academy.

1.2 Role and Powers

1. The Board of Governors may inter alia:-
 - a. Exercise supervision and control over the affairs of the Academy;
 - b. lay down the policy and program for training;
 - c. Initiate, modify, adopt the curriculum, courses, modules, clinics, for orientation and training;
 - d. Organize and carry out the activities and performance of the Authority;
 - e. Consider and approve the annual budget and revised budget estimate of the Academy;
 - f. Manage financial affairs;
 - g. Cause proper books of account to be maintained for all sums of money received and expenditure incurred by the Academy and arrange for audit of accounts;
 - h. Specify qualifications, conditions of service and matters relating to the Director General, faculty members and staff of the Academy;
 - i. Create, abolish, suspend and upgrade posts;
 - j. Purchase, hire, construct or alter any building for the use of the Academy;
 - k. Acquire, hold, control, maintain, administer, construct or dispose of any property, or other assets;
 - l. Acquire, maintain and dispose of any vehicle;
 - m. Affiliate the Academy with other academies, institutions and centers of the Federal, Provincial or Foreign Government and Organizations;
 - n. Appoint advisors, consultants and experts and specify their terms and conditions;
 - o. Appoint or hire permanent or visiting faculty and specify their terms and conditions; and
 - p. Decide any other matter ancillary or incidental to aims and objectives of the Academy.
2. Under section 6(2) of the Act, powers have been delegated to the Hon`ble Chairman of the Board, for performance of certain important functions of urgent nature.
3. Under section 8 of the Act, the management of the Academy is carried on, under the general directions of the Chairman of the Board, by the Director General as its academic and administrative head. He is responsible for the maintenance of good order and discipline and is also the Drawing and Disbursing officer of the Academy.

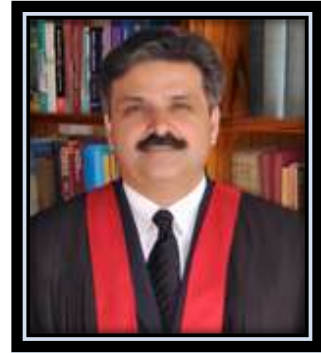

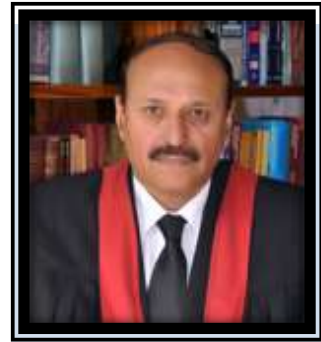

1.6 Powers and functions of the Director General

1. The Director General is appointed by the Chairman on such terms and conditions as may be approved by the Board.
2. The Management of the Academy is carried on by the Director General under the general directions of the Chairman;
3. The Director General is the academic and administrative head and also the Principal Accounting Officer of the Academy.

1.7 Appointment of Officers and Members of Staff of the Academy

1. The members of the staff of the Academy are appointed by direct recruitment, transfer and deputation in such manner and on such terms and conditions as envisaged in KPJA Staff (Terms & Conditions of Service) Rules, 2012.
2. Appointments of the members of the staff to posts in Basic Pay Scale 17 and above are made by the Chairman.
3. All appointments of the members of the staff to posts in Basic Pay Scale 1 to 16 are made by the Director General with the approval of the Chairman.

1.8 Principles of Policy

The purpose behind the establishment of the KPJA is to ensure that it imparts high quality training to the judicial officers and court personnel and the personnel of all those departments and institutions which are directly connected with the system of administration of justice. The development of curriculum apart, KPJA ensures to transfer knowledge, build skills and promote attitudes of all concerned with the administration of justice. The following principles of policy have been set out to define and prescribe the limits, to be observed by the faculty in particular and the staff in general, in the performance of their functions and for the promotion and fulfillment of its charter:

1.9 Aims and Objectives

The KPJA has been established under the KP Judicial Academy Act No. IV of 2012. The Aims and objectives of the Academy are:-

- a. To provide training to the judicial officers and court personnel and the personnel of all those departments, organizations, bodies and institutions, which are directly or indirectly connected with the system of administration of justice like Police, Prosecutors, Government Pleaders, Probation Officers, Medico Legal Experts and Others;
- b. To award certificates and other distinctions to the trainees and to prescribe standards of proficiency before awarding such certificates and distinctions, which may also form yardstick for future promotion of such officers subject to rules of respective services;
- c. To hold conferences, seminars, lectures, workshops and symposia in matters relating to court management, administration of justice, law and development of skills in legislative drafting;
- d. To initiate, promote and encourage research, publication of books, journals, research papers and reports on important topics relating to administration of justice;
- e. To establish liaison with research institutions, universities and other bodies including the Federal Judicial Academy, towards the cause of administration of justice; and
- f. To inculcate and promote ethical values and standards in judicial officers and in personnel connected with the system of administration of justice.

The Academy shall:

- Bring home the message that judicial power is a sacred trust and that the judges are accountable to their conscience and ultimately to ALLAH ALMIGHTY;
- Ensure the observance of high ethical standards and preserve impartiality, independence and professionalism;
- Help the judges, law officers, court personnel and all other concerned with the administration of justice to adhere to the highest standards of personal and official conduct;
- Establish and promote a comprehensive judicial education process to help judges meet the expectations of the society;

- Promote the concept of transparency and accountability and enhance public confidence in the administration of justice;
- Sensitize the trainee judges to decide cases in accordance with the law which they believe applies to the case before them, free from extraneous considerations or reward;
- Strengthen ethical values and professionalism among officers to promote efficient, effective, transparent and accountable administration.

1.10 Efforts for Excellence

To promote continuing legal and judicial education, KPJA vide KP Act No.XXI of 2015 on 12.05.2015 (**Annex-C**) has been given charter:

- To provide higher education in the field of law and judicial studies;
- To award certificates, degrees, diplomas and other distinctions to the students and trainees and to prescribe standards of proficiency before awarding such degrees, diplomas, certificates and distinctions;

2.1 Sixth Meeting of Board of Governors of KPJA

June 25, 2016.

The sixth meeting of the Board of Governors (BoG) was held here at the Academy on June 25, 2016. Mr. Justice Mazhar Alam Khan Miankhel, Honourable the Chief Justice PHC/Chairman presided over. The meeting was attended by Mr. Abdul Latif Yousafzai, Advocate General, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Mr. Muhammad Arifeen, Secretary Law, Parliamentary Affairs & Human Rights Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Mr. Ishtiaq Ahmad, Registrar Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, Mr. Muhammad Tariq Sohail, Additional Registrar (Administration), Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, Mr. Fazal Subhan, Member Inspection Team, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, Mr. Amin Bangash, Assistant Chief, Representative for Additional Chief Secretary, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Mr. Fayyaz-ur-Rehman, Principal, Khyber Law College, University of Peshawar and Mr. Ziauddin Khattak, Director General KPJA/ Secretary. The Board took up and approved several agenda items including the budget estimates for 2016-17, Endowment Fund, review and amendment in KPJA Rules, and the Financial Management performance of KPJA.

- In compliance with the decision made on agenda item No. 1 relating to Budget Estimates for 2016-17 the Finance Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa allocated the approved funds of Rs.73.000 million in the Budget Estimates of 2016-17 and as per release policy Rs. 29.200 million were released to KPJA (**Annex-D**).
- Further, in compliance with the decision made on agenda item No.2, the Director General Audit KP got conducted audit of the accounts of the Academy for the year 2015-16 on 25.07.2016, while that of 2014-15 on 19.12.2016.

2.2 Conference

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy (KPJA) Peshawar has set the trend by conducting 02- day conference on “**Women’s right to Inheritance**” from 28th-29th October 2017. It was first ever conference on the subject in the Academy. The conference was supported by the Strengthening Rule of Law Project (SRLP) UNDP with the financial assistance of Swiss Development Corporation (SDC).

Senior female Judicial Officers across KPK, Presidents of all Bar Associations of Provincially Administered Tribal Areas (PATA) and District Peshawar, Academia, senior officers of Provincial Government, representatives of local Government, Revenue officers from PATA, representatives of the organizations working for women’s rights, and officials of SRLM (UNDP) attended the Conference. Personalities of high repute were selected as resource persons for the conference. Vice Chancellor of RIFAH University Islamabad honored the conference as Guest Speaker.

Objectives of the conference were to create awareness on women’s right to inheritance, discussion on consciousness of women about their rights, privileges and immunities with particular reference to their right of inheritance, to sensitize the members of the civil society to the need and significance of the subject, to enhance the competence and capacity of judges as to prompt actions and proper implementation of the relevant laws, to discover the flaws of the laws on the subject, to explore the ways for its removal and further improvement and to build ethical standards in respect of women’s dignity, modesty, and concessions.

The last activity as per Agenda of the conference was deliberations amongst the participants. The objective of this session remained twofold; (a) to explore the grey areas of the issue under investigation, flaws in the system, hurdles in the society and all other factors that adversely affect the right of women to inheritance, and (b) to come up with practicable suggestions for improvement of the situation. For the purpose, participants were randomly divided into three groups. Each group was provided with a faculty member of the Academy as facilitator. The consolidated recommendations on **religious, social, academic, and legal** aspects of the issue were as under:

1. Provisions of the **Surah ‘Nissa’** of the Holy Quran mandating the right of women to the pre-fixed shares in inheritance should be included in the syllabi of law schools, colleges and universities having law faculties.

2. The religious scholarship should be encouraged for enlightening the general masses on the significance of the issue and its fragile nature under Shariah. The issue should be, off and on, discussed with the required zeal in various religious ceremonies and addresses.
3. The religious scholarship should also encourage the participation of females in religious ceremonies as it had been ensured in the lifetime of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W).
4. For claims of inheritance, special separate law should be framed both on substantive and adjective sides, as it has been done in cases of family issues. By this way, a possible and practicable get rid of the lengthy, cumbersome and complicated hearing procedure could be achieved.
5. Following the example of consumer courts, separate courts with permanent separate presiding officers should be established for hearings claims of inheritance. The jurisdiction of the ordinary civil courts ought to be ousted.
6. Specialized trainings on the subject are highly essential for all concerned; law and policy makers, judges, lawyers, revenue officers, staff of the financial institutions (banks being on the top), religious scholars and members of the civil society, particularly the females.
7. To achieve the objective above, judicial academies of the country should prepare purpose-based courses for such trainings. Services of the competent resource persons should be hired, for it has been noticed that the lack of interest of lawyers and judges in the inheritance suits, inter alia, owes to the want of requisite expertise in the subject.
8. The prevailing practice in the revenue offices regarding mutilations of inheritance is passive to a disappointing extent. Necessary and urgent administrative directives should be issued to all revenue officers at *Tehsil* levels to ensure a *suo moto* and expeditious registration of inheritance mutations.
9. Immovability of the women folk under the customary concept of modesty ought to be minimized to the possible extent. NGO's should not interfere here, for it would be counter-productive. The objective should rather be achieved through religious scholars who would be in a better position to convince the masses that that movability of women within the prescribed limits of *Shariah* is not only permissible but recommended as well.

10. The women usually do not possess the required expenses for litigation. The governments should provide for all the needful in this regard.
11. Shariah itself recognizes ADR mechanism in inheritance. ADR mandating (not mere enabling provision should be introduced in the expected separate legislation on the issue.
12. Presently, all energies are consumed rather wasted in unwanted, illogic and self-invented controversies in the shares distribution system of Shariah. This **practice consecutively** takes us away from the objective. According to Islamic Law and its Jurisprudence, the subject falls within the area where the interference of human intellect is expressly barred. The system provided by Shariah is quite comprehensive, just and equitable, All concerned should, therefore, divert their energies to the issue of deprivation of women from their pre-prescribed shares in inheritance, for this is the problem that a woman is literally facing in Pakistani society.
13. Procedure for obtaining succession certificate should be simplified and made easy. Powers for its **free of cost** issuance should be granted to the representatives of the local governments at village levels.
14. Apart from inheritance, mother being a female, too aged and enough infirm is deprived from other monetary legacies of the deceased under the ordinary definition of family. She should be included in the family members of the deceased.
15. Whenever there is a talk on the rights of women, the phrase women is usually taken to mean 'wife'. It is certainly a wrong and narrow comprehension of the phrase. Emphasis should be placed **to** remove of this misconception and it ought to be believed that the **phrase** 'women' is aimed to include mothers, grandmothers, sisters, daughters, nieces, aunts, and of course wives.
16. While dealing inheritance claims, the learned judges should utilize their own skills and knowledge. The use of inheritance calculators available on the internet should be restricted to cross- check purposes only. Blind reliance on these gadgets, at times, may prove fatal and may not be fully identical to the facts of case in hand.

2.3 Ground Breaking of Hostel Building

Honorable The Chief Justice Of Peshawar High Court, Mr. Justice **MAZHAR ALAM KHAN MIANKHEL** Inaugurates Hostel Block Of KP Judicial Academy



In a historic ceremony on 19.11.2016, Justice Mazhar Alam Khan Miankhel, Honorable the Chief Justice of Peshawar High Court inaugurated the construction of the Hostel Block of KP Judicial Academy. The project comprises two hostel blocks, faculty suits, gymnasium, computer lab, servant residences and administration block. Needs of women judges and those of special persons are also taken care of while designing the structure of the building. It has the capacity to house twenty four (24) male and sixteen (16) female participants. The hostel will cost Rs 229.810 million to be provided by the provincial government. The project is expected to be completed in 18 months.

Addressing the participants of the ceremony, the Chief Justice said that the KP Judicial Academy, a training institution for judicial officers, is one of the leading judicial academies in the country. He also praised the Judicial Academy and said that the hostel complex has been beautifully designed. Chief Justice said that the construction of a judicial hostel in the KP Judicial Academy was a long-standing dream which would finally see the light of day.

3.1 General Training Program (GTP)

To establish a new regime of judicial education where every judicial officer and court personnel is provided some of the professional training and education every year, the Academy has designed General Training Programs (GTP) for different levels of judicial officers. The present program is first one to come in this regard. The new program will commence in 2017. The present GTP is designed for all judicial officers keeping in view their respective role in administration of justice. To make them a role model and good manager, the focus of GTP is on developing management skills, financial administration skills, human resource management skills, court and case management skills, stress management skills, IT skills and some skills in other dimensions of their respective office. **(Annex-A)**

4.1 Research Activities

One of the aims and objects of the KPJA is to provide judicial education and conduct research in the field of law and judicial studies. To further these, the academy has undertaken the following research studies:

1. Strengthening application of Bail Provisions for children in conflict with law.
2. Bench Book/ Ready Reckoner for Judicial Officers

The Academy developed a bench book. It is meant for facilitating the judicial officers to have easy and handy reference to day to day procedural business. The format of the book is such that everyone especially new comer in judiciary should have easy access to relevant law without referring to bulky material on the subject. An effort is made to give reference to delegated legislation and case law also where relevant and possible. It is a guide to the general administration of district judiciary, the working of civil and criminal courts. Sufficient space has been reserved in the book for judicial ethics, which would be beneficial for judicial officers in adopting core values of judiciary as, justice should not only be done but should manifestly and undoubtly be seen to be done. It is expected that the readers will make good use of this book so that the purpose of whole exercise is achieved.

4.2 Library, Collection Development and Enhancement

KPJA has a state of the art library. Over 4000 books, periodicals, journals, research studies and other reading material are included in the library collection. The reading room and collections are open to the faculty members, participants of different training courses and workshops and the employees of the Academy, researchers, among others, during regular library hours. Library staff is available to the judicial officers with research material. The library has access to HEC Digital Library, PLD and PLJ journals. Fifty (50) general links providing access to 5000 books are also available. KPJA subscribed to the books, journals etc. given in the table below during calendar year 2016.

7.2 KPJA-UNICEF PAKISTAN PROJECT

Strengthening application of bail provisions for Juveniles in conflict with law.

The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) is a United Nations (UN) programme that provides humanitarian and developmental assistance that includes access to justice to children in developing countries.

KP Judicial Academy is mandated with the capacity building of the justice sector through training related activities. Thus, it is our top priority to facilitate and support an intervention in justice sector for enhancing its service delivery. With this convergence of interest between UNICEF and KPJA; a project aimed at strengthening the application of bail provisions for Juveniles in conflict with law was visualized.

The Project document provides for a partnership between KPJA and UNICEF. The prime objective of this project is to ensure the judicious application of the bail provisions for juveniles in conflict with law. The geographic coverage is limited to District Peshawar and Swat. The service of a professional researcher is hired to conduct field research.

The Researcher/ Consultant visited the target Districts of Peshawar and Swat. She had interviewed key justice sector personals in the those Districts. Collected, scanned and securitized the relevant record and identified the gaps in the application of bail provisions.

Based upon the identified gaps, 02 curricula for training of justice sector personals was formulated. The key justice sector's representatives were trained in a 05-day Training of the Trainers programs and thereafter the trainees were tasked to impart trainings to groups having representation of the justice sector.

Presently, the project is in the stage of impact evaluation of the trainings so imparted. Once, the efficacy of the training programs is gauged, the lessons learnt shall be disseminated for ensuring wide spread awareness.

CHAPTER -8 INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY

8.1 IT Facilities & its Utilization in the Academy

The KPJA is equipped with state of the art information technology (IT) infrastructure. All the offices, class rooms, auditorium and computer lab are connected with local area network (LAN). The wifi facility is also available in the Academy to facilitate the trainee participants. The Academy has its own website which is regularly maintained, updated and improved through the web developer who is a permanent employee. The catalogue of the library is automated and the software has been indigenously programmed at the Academy. This catalogue has been uploaded to the website and is accessible to the general public. Similarly an asset tracking system has also been designed and programmed by the KPJA programmer. It keeps track of all movable assets of KPJA and it is updated through bar code readers. The IT wing has also developed a prototype of training database called the activity management system (AMS). It regularly updates the training profiles of both trainers and trainees. It has a separate module meant for evaluation. This system works on online evaluation through randomly sorted multiple choice questions. In this way both the trainees and the trainers can be objectively evaluated. At an elementary level there is payroll software in operation which has also been designed at KPJA.

8.2 Technological Development

The year 2016 brought with it a new era of technological development at KPJA. A class room; fully automated and having an interactive environment has been developed with active support of UNDP. Besides, the state of art interact board, each participant has internet access through Tablets. The evaluation through Activity Management System [AMS] can now be conveniently carried out in the Class.

8.3 Radio Meezan FM 96.6

The role of media in information sharing has been growing spectacularly with the recognition of the right to information fundamental right in the Constitution, Mass Media has assumed a Significant role. Among mass media , FM radio has been more effective in recent time. FM Radio is accessible to verities of people at different places, most notably , in the rural areas, where others, such as , TV and the internet may not be easily accessible. Information-sharing through mass Media is the fashion of the day. Easy , cheap and frequent accessibility to mass media has, in addition to others , rise the level of expectations the public has to know about such information from key public Sector/institutions, which has an impact on their lives. The Judiciary is one such institution that has been in the limelight needless to say, for the reason of its being the custodian of the rights of the people responsible for checking excesses by all, including government institution.

8.3.1 Background

As a non-commercial non- political facility , Meezan Radio operates under the PEMRA Rules. The frequency allotted to the radio is FM 96.6. The target area of the radio is initially Peshawar , which will be extended to the whole province in due course of time.

9.1 Mediation Centre KPJA

These days there is an increasing trend of resorting to Alternative Dispute Resolution mechanism to settle disputes. ADR mechanism including mediation and conciliation inserted in the Civil Procedure Code, 1908 vide section 89-A that supplement existing court process, is beneficial for the litigants as they have added choice and also for relieving some of the burden of the courts. The Academy has taken a lead by the establishment of the Mediation Centre in its premises. The centre is headed by an In charge, who manages all its affairs. When a dispute is referred to the centre, the In charge is authorized either to mediate himself or to appoint mediator with consent of the parties.

Functions:

The centre will perform the following key functions:

- **To mediate between the parties, requested for mediation/arbitration.**
- **To maintain data of cases resolved through mediation.**
- **To follow up the decision of the mediators/arbitrators.**

Facilities:

The mediation centre has been established with in the premises of the Academy. A large room with all necessary facilities for mediation has been dedicated for the purpose. There is a counseling corner in the centre, where the parties are counseled about the prospects of good mediation.

9.2 Case Referral Procedure

A Standard Operating Procedure (SoP), has been formulated in order to streamline the procedural aspects regarding case referral to Mediation centre.

10.1 New Campus

Under section 4 of the KP Judicial Academy Act No. IV of 2012, the Academy is mandated to impart training not only to the Judicial officers but to the paralegal staff and other personnel of Departments related to justice sector i.e., police, prosecution, probation, jail and much more. Recently, the Academy vide KP Judicial Academy (Amendment) Act, 2015 has been given Degree awarding status institution in future and the present building will work as one of the campuses of the Academy. For this purpose, land measuring 150 kanal has been allotted to the Academy by the KP Government at Regi Model Town Peshawar. Construction of a new campus is the future plan of the Academy. Presently, this project is at consultancy stage. The proposed new campus would include class rooms, lecture halls, seminar rooms, auditorium, library, computer labs, research centers, radio studios, administration block, mock court rooms, mosque, dining halls, hostels, resource person's suites, baby- day- care centre, playgrounds, gymnasium and swimming pool.

10.2 Safety and Security Systems

The Strengthening Rule of Law project (SRLM) launched by UNDP in 2012 has been included in the Annual Development Plan (ADP) 2016-17, with an outlay of PKR 800 million, out of which PKR 600 million will be provided by the donors and PKR 200 million by the Provincial Government through the cost sharing agreement. Mr. Dilroz Khan, FCA, who conducted study at the instance of UNDP for providing institutional support to KPJA has recommended the following safety and security measures:

- A. The Academy campus should be equipped with outdoor "Emergency" telephones, with two-way call boxes should be located strategically around the campus. These allow an individual in need of assistance to speak directly with the Public Safety Department. Activation of the call button on the pedestal "Emergency" model will immediately identify the caller's location, and the Public Safety Department will direct the appropriate emergency response team to the caller. All "Emergency" telephones should be equipped with a bright blue light which stays illuminated at all times to ensure visibility, which would be used only in the case of an emergency.

- B. All the buildings on campus should be equipped with card access systems to help ensure security within the building.
- C. Closed circuit security cameras should be strategically placed throughout campus to help ensure the safety and security of all trainees, faculty, staff and guests. These cameras are also used to aid the Public Safety Department with investigations.
- D. All Public Safety Department Officers are CPR, First Aid and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) certified. AED's are carried in each patrol vehicle and are also strategically located across campus. In the event of a medical emergency the Public Safety Department will respond and make the determination if Ambulance needs to be contacted for further evaluation or transport to a local hospital for necessary treatment.
- E. All buildings should be equipped with fire, elevator safety and area intrusion alarms monitored by 24 hours a day and 365 days a year.
- F. Fire alarm pull-stations are connected to a building fire protection system and should be provided near the entrance to each stairwell on every floor/building. Each apartment kitchen is equipped with a chemical extinguisher located under the sink. All campus buildings are also equipped with sprinkler systems and smoke detectors.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy Act, 2012 (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. IV of 2012), for the purposes hereinafter appearing:

It is hereby enacted as follows:

1. Short title and commencement.—(1) This Act may be called the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy Act, 2015.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. Substitution of the Preamble of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. IV of 2012.--- In the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy Act, 2012 (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. IV of 2012), hereinafter referred to as the said Act, for the preamble, the following shall be substituted, namely:

"WHEREAS it is expedient to establish a Judicial Academy for imparting training to the judicial officers and personnel concerned with the system of administration of justice with a view to promote continuing legal and judicial education, develop their capacity, professional competence and ethical standard for efficient dispensation of justice and matters connected therewith or incidental thereto and to provide higher education and conduct research in the field of law and judicial studies;

It is hereby enacted as follows,"

3. Amendment of section 4 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. IV of 2012.- In the said Act, in section 4,-

(a) after clause (a), the following new clause shall be inserted, namely:-

"(aa) to provide higher education in the field of law and judicial studies;"

(b) for clause (b), the following shall be substituted, namely:

"(b) to award certificates, degrees, diplomas and other distinctions to the students and trainees and to prescribe standards of proficiency before awarding such degrees, diplomas, certificates and distinctions;" and

(c) for clause (e), the following shall be substituted, namely:

"(e) to establish liaison with research institutions, universities and other bodies including the Federal Judicial Academy and the Higher Education Commission, towards the cause of administration of justice for legal and judicial education;"

4. Amendment of section 5 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. IV of 2012.--- In the said Act, in section 5,-

(a) in clause (j), the word "and" occurring at the end shall be deleted;

(b) in clause (k), the full-stop appearing at the end shall be replaced by semi-colon and thereafter the word "and" shall be added; and

(c) after clause (k), as so amended, the following new clause shall be added, namely:

"(l) a representative of the Higher Education Commission, not below the rank of basic pay scale 20 officer Member."

5. Amendment of section 6 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. IV of 2012.--- In the said Act, in section 6, in sub-section (1), after the words "the Board shall", the comma and words ", subject to the provisions of this Act" shall be added.

6. Insertion of new sections 10A and 10B to the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act IV of 2012.--- In the said Act, after section 10, the following new sections shall be inserted, namely:

10A. Appointment of Controller Examination.--- The Controller of Examinations shall be appointed by initial recruitment on contract basis and if no suitable person is available for initial recruitment then by deputation for a period of three years, on such terms and conditions of service as may be prescribed.

10B. Academic Council.--- (1) There shall be an Academic Council, which shall comprise of-

(2) The Academic Council shall be responsible for all academic matters including course, syllabi, examinations, degrees, diplomas, certificates and other matters connected therewith and ancillary thereto.

(3) The meetings of the Academic Council shall be held at least once in six months.

(4) The Dean Faculty of the Judicial Academy shall be the Secretary of the Council and in the absence of the Chairperson, Dean Faculty of the Judicial Academy shall preside over the meeting.

(5) The quorum of a meeting of the Academic Council shall be one half of the total members.

(6) All decisions shall be made by the majority of the members present in the Council's meeting.

7. Amendment of section 12 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act IV of 2012.---In the said Act, in section 12, in sub-section (2), after clause (b), the following new clause shall be inserted, namely:

"(bb) grants made by the Higher Education Commission, or any Federal or Provincial Agency;"
