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Foreword

BY THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy (KPJA) was established in the year 2012 vide the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy Act No. IV of 2012. Sub-Section (1) of Section 15 of the Act requires that within two months of the conclusion of each calendar year the Director General shall submit the ‘**Annual Report**’ to the Board of Governors (BOG) in respect of various activities carried out by the Academy during the previous year.

Transparency is one of the major components of good governance. The periodical reporting of performance of public sector organizations and institutions is considered a step towards transparency. The Academy being a public sector organization presents its performance annually as a statutory responsibility. This report would reveal that how this institution utilizes the resources and whether the efforts of the Academy are in the right direction towards the achievements of the objectives for which this Academy has been established.

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy had indeed a fruitful year. Highlights thereof include the continued capacity building of the justice sector, reflected in an array of trainings imparted by the Academy. During this period, most of the targets were achieved in shape of eighty (80) trainings/workshops/seminars that include post promotion training of Senior Civil Judges and Additional District & Sessions Judges. To fulfill the core objective of its existence, i.e. legal orientation and training of members of the subordinate judiciary and law officers, the Academy conducted several training sessions during the year 2021, for all stakeholders of justice system and trained 1600 justice sector personnel.

In order to reduce the spread of Covid-19, most countries around the globe including Pakistan decided to temporarily close educational institutions. However, the Academy took this challenge as an opportunity and continued to play its role for providing quality Judicial Education to the stakeholders of Justice System subject to all safety precautions. Due to pandemic, forty-nine (49) online sessions were conducted throughout the year. These trainings were conducted through ZOOM. The Judges of different cadres and lawyers attended these online activities on Civil Case Management Rules & Scheduling Conference, and Criminal Trial with focus on Mental illness including Forensic Health Assessment under the instructions of the apex court.

The Academy in collaboration with UN Women arranged a “Three-day Professional Development Training for Family Court Judges”. The objectives of the course were to give orientation about the legal framework of Family Courts in Pakistan, Composition, Functions,

Jurisdiction, and Specialized Procedure of Family Courts, Restitution of conjugal rights, Jactitation of Marriage, Domestic Violence, Maintenance of Wife & Children, and Custody of Children. The importance of the office of the judge family court was emphasized in the prevailing era with focus that the Family Court should make all-out efforts and strive hard to mend the broken family ties by using the means of conciliation & mediation.

The Academy in collaboration with Group Development Pakistan arranged a series of training for judges, prosecution and the police on “Gender Based Violence”. The core purpose of these training programs were to strengthen the criminal justice system’s response to vulnerable segment of the society.

Lawyers play an important part in the administration of justice. The profession itself requires the safeguarding of high moral standards. Legal community and advocates are inseparable and important part of robust legal system and they not only aid in seeking access to justice but also promote justice. Judges cannot perform their task of dispensing justice effectively without the able support of advocates. In that sense, advocates play an important role in the administration of justice. A series of training programs were conducted on Professional Development & Legal Ethics for lawyers across the province.

To raise the standard of knowledge of the support staff of the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, the Academy under the instructions of Hon’ble the Chief Justice, arranged one week Professional Development Training for Senior Scale Stenographers and Steno-typists. The training program was successfully concluded by improving their understanding of court room procedures besides secretarial work, ethics, and soft skills.

The other core objective of the Academy is to provide information on legal and constitutional research and also conduct the research. During the year 2021, the Academy accomplished several studies including the development of Draft Rules for Consumer Courts; Protection & Welfare of Children at Risk; International Human Rights with focus on Afghan Refugees; and the Bench Book for District Judiciary. Besides this, the Academy has tendered advice on legislative proposals to the Home and Tribal Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy following its aims & objectives as per Section 4 of KPJA Act, 2012 has drawn up the Annual Calendar for the year 2021 for imparting quality legal education and judicial training to all the stakeholders of the justice sector. It is available on the official website of the Academy. The new calendar of KPJA is self-contained and self-explanatory regarding the vision for the judicial year 2021 (**Annex-A**). Every training will focus

on knowledge, skills, and attitude (KSA) for the trainees. The calendar for this year has a new feature, i.e., "every Judge every year". Efforts were made to give an opportunity to every Judicial Officer to be at Academy for at least one day for a short training course during the year.

Besides, the Academy has been able to make considerable savings. Thus, the Endowment Fund, which started with Rs 50 million, is expected to reach Rs 200 million in March 2022.

Finally, I would respectfully acknowledge with gratitude the continued support of Mr. Justice Qaiser Rashid Khan, Hon'ble the Chief Justice, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar/ Chairman of the Academy, Dean/Directors, officers and staff of KPJA, in carrying forward the vision and mission of the Academy.

The Khyber Pukhtunkhwa Judicial Academy is a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal with power to acquire, hold and dispose of property both moveable and immovable and may, by the said name, sue and be sued. 2.1 Role and Powers of Board of Governors

The Board of Governors shall:-

- a. exercise supervision and control over the affairs of the Academy;
- b. lay down the policy and program for training;
- c. initiate, modify, adopt the curriculum, courses, modules, clinics, for orientation and training;
- d. organize and carry out the activities and performance of the authority;
- e. consider and approve the annual budget and revised budget estimate of the Academy;
- f. manage financial affairs;
- g. cause proper books of account to be maintained for all sums of money received and expenditure incurred by the Academy and arrange for audit of accounts;
- h. specify qualifications, conditions of service and matters relating to the director general, faculty members and staff of the Academy;
- i. create, abolish, suspend and upgrade posts;
- j. purchase, hire, construct or alter any building for the use of the Academy;
- k. acquire, hold, control, maintain, administer, construct or dispose of any property, or other assets;
- l. acquire, maintain and dispose of any vehicle;
- m. affiliate the Academy with other academies, institutions and centers of the federal, provincial or foreign government and organizations;
- n. appoint advisors, consultants and experts and specify their terms and conditions;
- o. appoint or hire permanent or visiting faculty and specify their terms and conditions; and
- p. decide any other matter ancillary or incidental to aims and objectives of the Academy.

Powers have been delegated to the Hon'ble the Chairman of the Board of Governors, members or the Director General for performance of certain important functions of urgent nature.

Being administrative and academic head, the Director General, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Academy manages the affairs of the Academy under the general direction of the Chairman.

2.2 Appointment, Powers and functions of the Director General

- a. The Director General is appointed by the Chairman on such terms and conditions as may be approved by the Board.
- b. He manages the affairs of the Academy under the general directions of the Chairman;
- c. He is the academic and administrative head. He is also the Principal Accounting Officer of the Academy.
- d. He is the DDO of the Academy.
- e. He executes the policy, set out by the Board of Governors (BOG).

2.3 Appointment of Officers and Members of Staff of the Academy

The members of the staff of the Academy are appointed by direct recruitment, transfer or deputation in such a manner and on such terms and conditions as envisaged in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy Staff (Terms & Conditions of Service) Rules, 2012.

Appointments of the members of the staff to posts in Basic Pay Scale 17 and above are made by the Chairman. All appointments of the members of the staff to posts in Basic Pay Scale 1 to 16 are made by the Director General with the approval of the Chairman.

2.4 Meeting of the Board of Governors

The Board of Governors (BoG) of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy held its twelfth (12th) meeting on June 28, 2021, at 3:00 PM in the BoG Hall of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy, Peshawar. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Qaiser Rashid Khan, Chief Justice, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar/Chairman, Board of Governors (BoG), Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy, and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Rooh-ul-Amin Khan, Senior Puisne Judge, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar/Vice-Chairman, Board of Governors (BoG), Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy presided over the meeting. All the members of the Board were present.



In the meeting, follow-up of the previously decided matters was conducted and various administrative decisions on the agenda items including the annual budget of the Academy, actuarial study of the pension rules, ongoing developmental projects etc were taken.

3.1 ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES (ON CAMPUS)

3.1.1 One Week Post-Promotion Statutory Training for Additional District & Sessions Judges/ Izafi Zilla Qazis held on 8th to 13th February, 2021

The cadre of Additional District & Sessions Judges/ Izafi Zilla Qazi's is an important tier in the District Judiciary. They are court of first appellate jurisdiction in most civil and criminal cases, besides having original jurisdiction in respect of trial of serious offences like murder etc and civil proceedings. They are also ex-officio justice of peace under section 25 of CrPC and designated as tribunal for special subjects. Therefore they need the expertise and abilities to judicial business.

The Academy arranged one week Post-Promotion Statutory Training for them from 8th to 13th February 2021. The Academy invited expert resource persons to share their expertise, knowledge and experience with the participants. The topics selected for interaction of resource persons with participants were included:

5. Qisas and Diyat,
6. Appreciation of Evidence,
7. Management of the Sessions Trial,
8. Sentencing Guidelines,
9. Maintenance of record,
10. Expeditious disposal of stagnant category of cases, and
11. Management and Disposal of cases by diversion under the Juvenile Justice System Act, 2018 (specific to Child Protection Court)

3.1.2 Three Trainings of two days durations for newly Inducted Lawyers of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province (08-09 January, 2021, 10-11 March, and 11-12th June 2021)

The Lawyers are termed as the most essential pillars of the justice system. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy while performing its prime objective, aims to design specialized training modules for the members of legal fraternity.

Lawyers are professionally required to provide legal counseling to public by helping them understand and navigate the legal system. Owing to the nature of their work, they should be well-equipped in legal knowledge and a better understanding of the court procedures. Attesting its commitment to enhance practitioners' skills, the Academy arranged 02-day training, wherein newly inducted lawyers from districts Swabi, Abbottabad, Mardan, Kohat and Haripur participated. The Academy focused on the young lawyers having two to four years standing at the Bar. The participants, were imparted trainings in the areas of Professional Conduct (Duty to the Court, Client, fellow Advocates, and Public Generally), Administration of Justice (Civil & Criminal Trials), Proceedings of Preventive Jurisdictions(u/s 107/133/145 CrPC) Professional Skills (Drafting Skills) Production and Effect of Evidence (Burden of Proof & Examination of Witnesses), and Professional Responsibilities and Legal Ethics. The resource persons referred to the latest case laws and practical aspects of the subjects. During the lectures, the participants were engaged in academic activities through group discussions on various important topics e.g. Bar & Bench Liaison, delay in trials, and conduct of a lawyer in court. Per the feedback of the participants, the training was evaluated as excellent and beneficial. They expressed their satisfaction in acquiring in-depth knowledge in various areas of law.

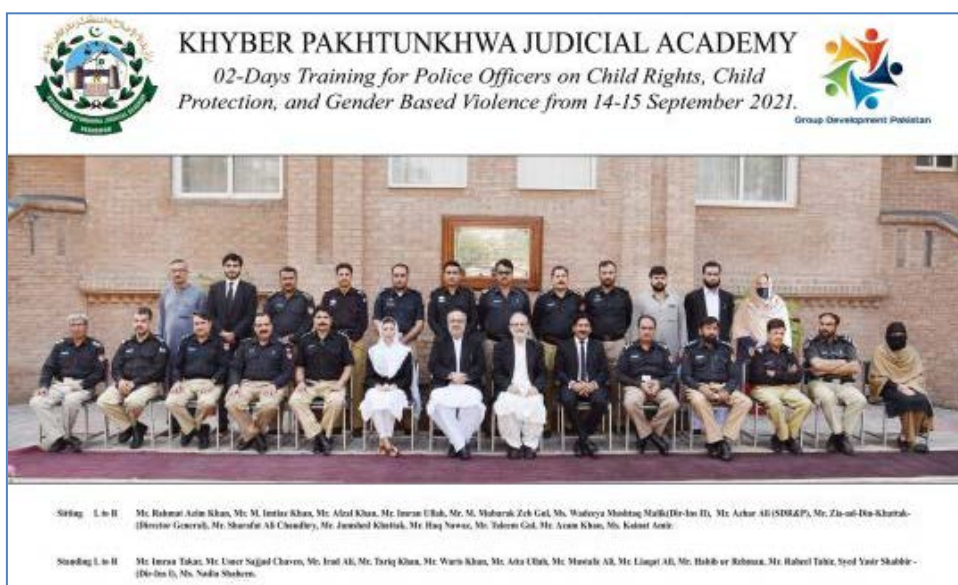
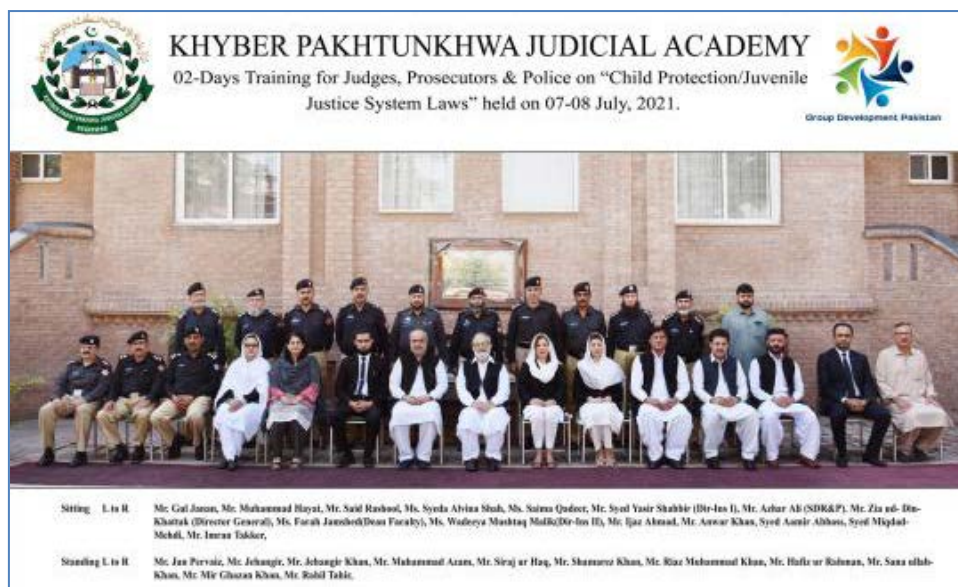
The minors and the young population together constitute 52% of the total population of Pakistan. Realizing their rights, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Child Protection & Welfare Act was enacted in 2010. The first Child Protection Court was established in the provincial headquarter Peshawar followed by the establishment of such courts at each divisional headquarter of the Province, having taken the number of such courts in the Province to eight.

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy cognizant of the importance of training on the subject organized three, 02-Days trainings in collaboration with Group Development Pakistan (GDP) to impart training to the judges, prosecutors, and the local Police (Investigation Officers) in this regard. The trainings were held as per following schedule:

02-Days Training for Parole Officers on "Child Rights, Child Protection, and Gender Based Violence' on 14th-15th September, 2021.





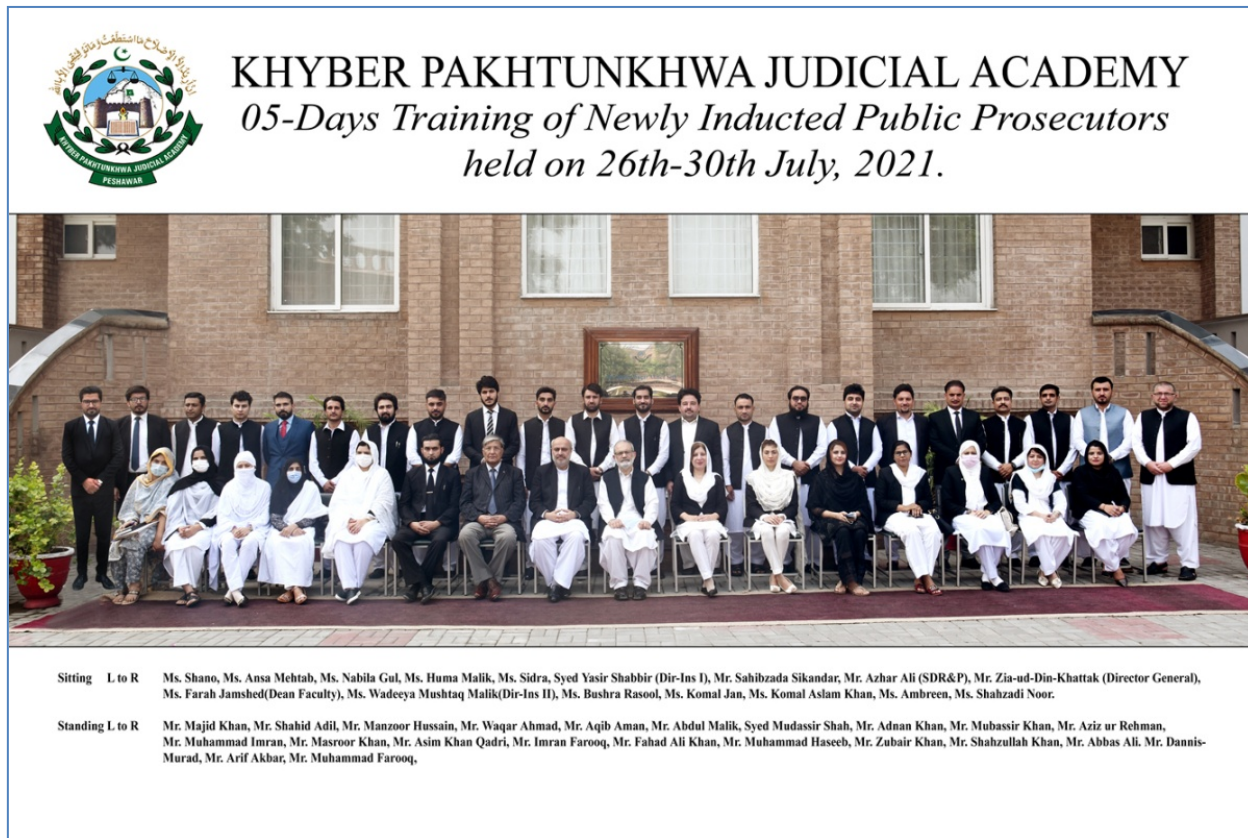
3.1.4 05-Day Pre-Service Training for Newly Inducted Assistant Public Prosecutors

3.1.6 02-Day Training For Newly Appointed Probation and Parole Officers

The Reclamation and Probation is an attached Department of the Home & Tribal Affairs Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. It is a part and parcel of the Criminal Justice System. 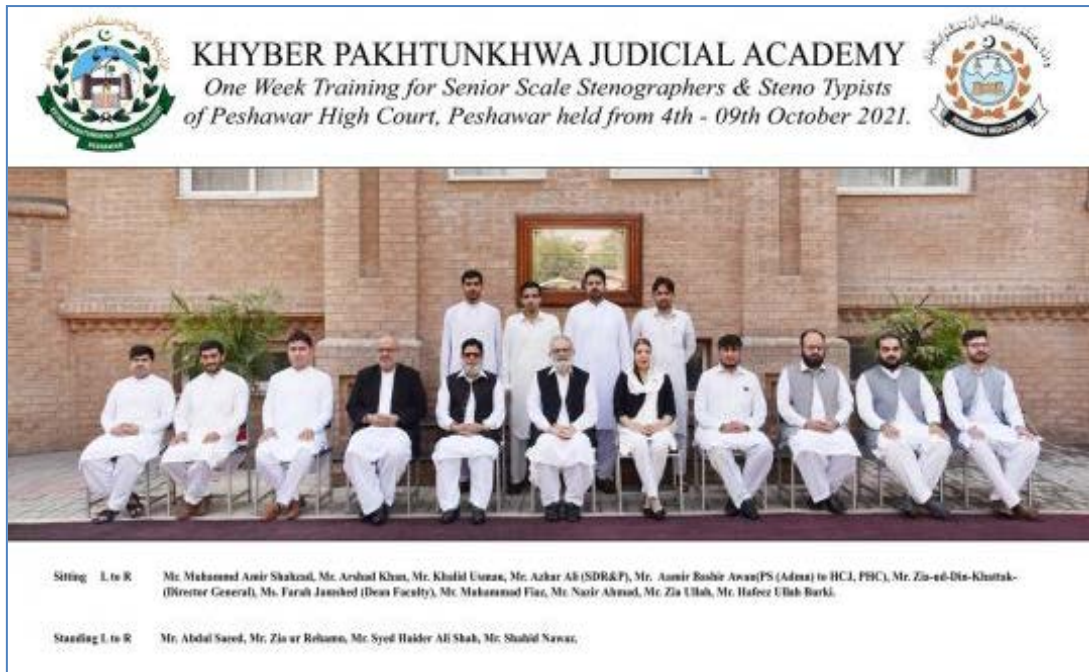

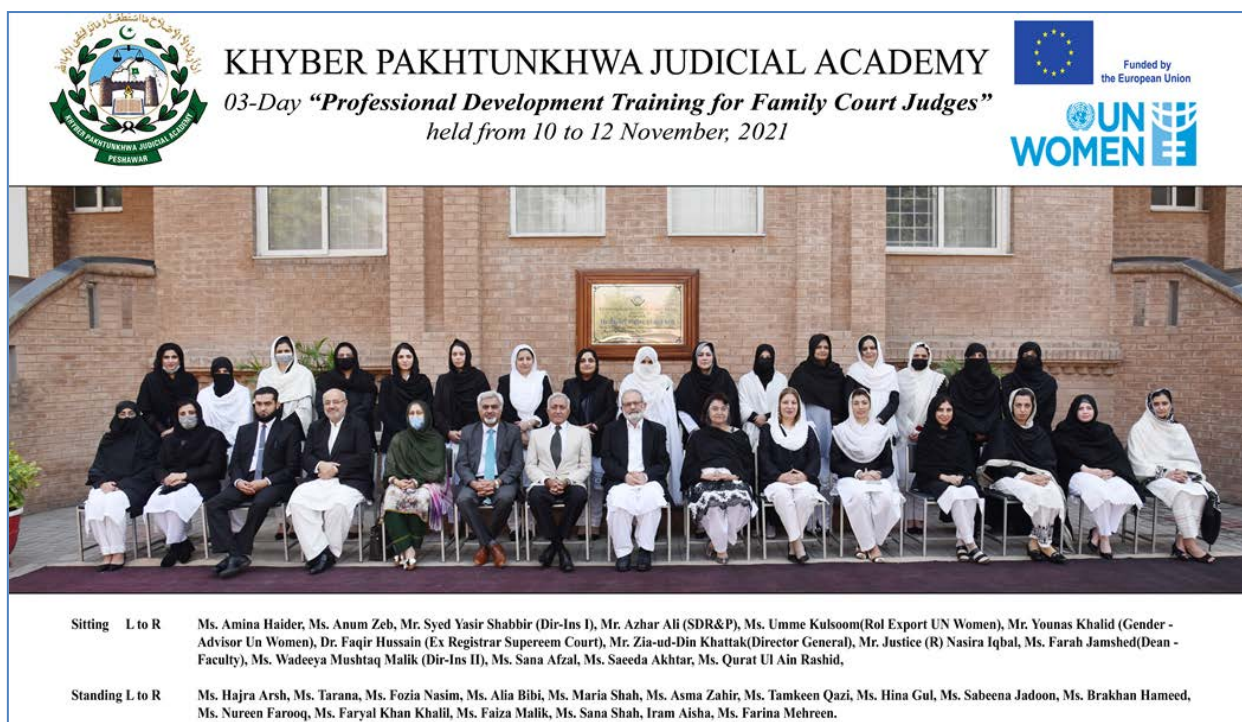

- *To promote conciliation and mediation in disputes relating family matters.*

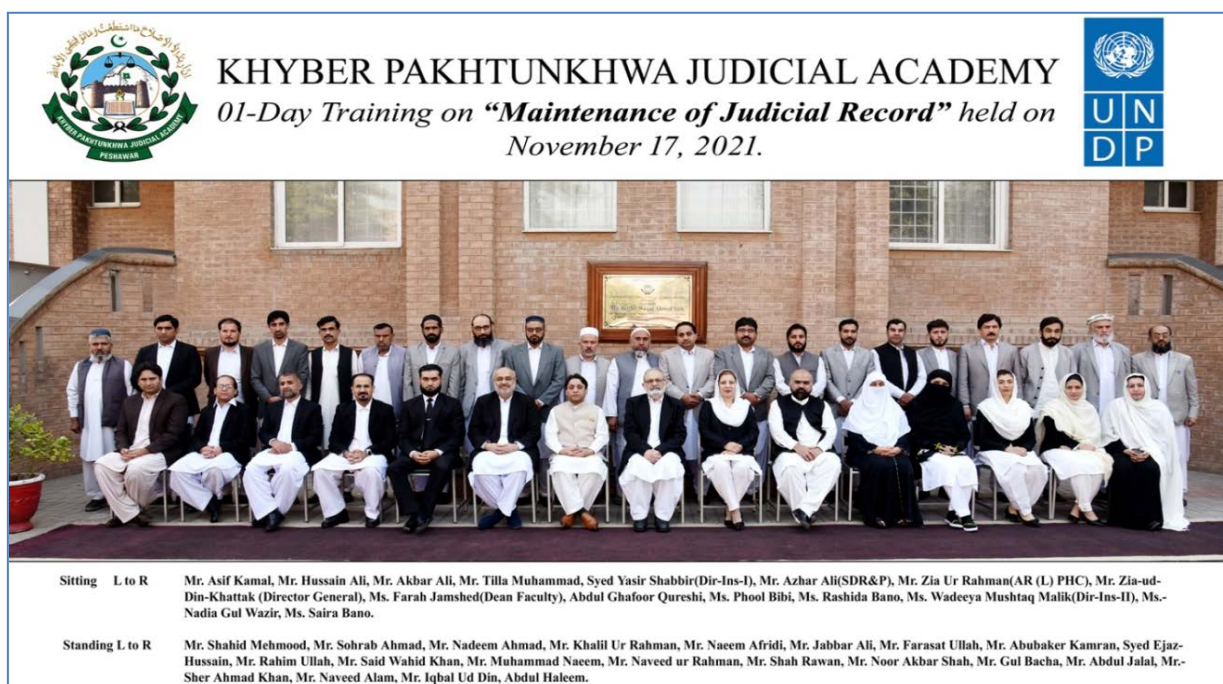


3.1.10 01-Day Training on Maintenance of Judicial Record

To sensitize the participants of the training of management of judicial record in an efficacious manner and to motivate them towards exploring and utilizing tools for achievement of organizational targets.

Judicial Record is a court record or an official entry of the court proceedings or judicial action of the Judicial Officer in such proceedings. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy had designed a comprehensive module for district judiciary on the management of judicial record with the aim of refining the professional skills of the responsible quarters for effective and efficient delivery of services. The importance of Maintenance of Judicial Record is also highlighted in the Annual Inspection Report 2020 of Hon'ble the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar. In this regard, under the instructions of the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, the Academy arranged a series of seven consecutive, 01- day training (from 15th to 30th November 2021) on Maintenance of Judicial Record. The participants included nominees of District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges (Judicial), *Muharrars*, Record Keepers, and In-charge of Copying Agency from all over Khyber Pakhtunkhwa including the newly merged districts (NMDs).

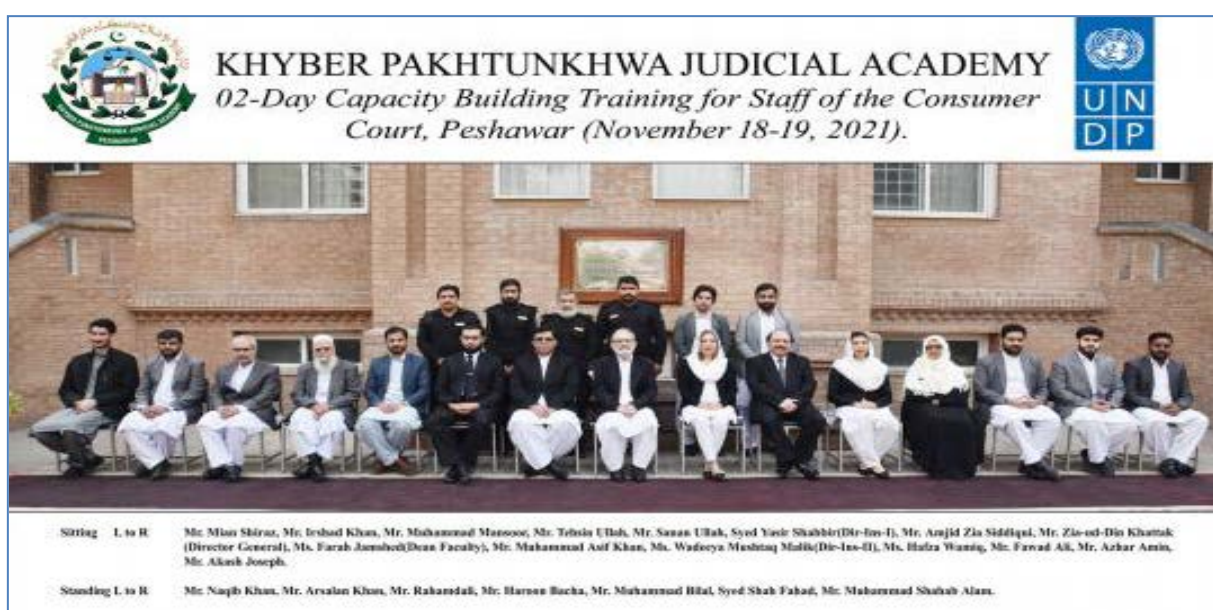
3.1.11 02-Day Capacity Building Training for Staff of the Consumer Court, Peshawar

The Consumer Courts have been established by the Provincial Government in the year 2016, under section 11A of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Consumer Protection Act, 1997. Presently, nineteen (19) courts are functional. In order to improve the efficiency of the consumer courts, capacity building of the court staff becomes imperative.

Aims & Objectives

- To enhance their moral and ethical values.
- To make them understand their job description.
- To enhance their administrative skills.
- To impart them efficient, practical & effective management, and communication skills.
- To pass on them basic skills necessary for the efficient and effective performance of their ministerial duties.

Court staff is an integral part of the justice system. There can be no court without staff. In short, court staff plays a significant role in the administration of justice. Capacity building of the court staff is as important as that of judicial officers. With this view in end, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy arranged 02-day training for the support/ministerial staff of Consumer Court, Peshawar from 18th to 19th November 2021. All 15 members participated. The focus of the training was to sensitize them with their role and responsibilities viz-a-viz their job description and to familiarize them with the court and its administrative affairs, in general, and the maintenance of record; Office Management; Financial Management and Courts Processes, in particular.



3.1.12 01-Week Post-Promotion Statutory Training for Additional District & Sessions Judges/ Izafi Zilla Qazis

Capacity building in every field of judicial activity is a *sine-qua-non* for streamlining the system in its entirety. As per Rule 9(4) of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Service Rules, 2001, read with Notification No. 5-J dated 20-12-2003, a probationer judicial officer is required to successfully complete statutory training. With this end in view, One-Week Post-Promotion Statutory training for the Additional District & Sessions Judges was held at the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy. The subject training course was tailored and designed in an exclusive manner so that the newly promoted Additional District & Sessions Judges may be benefited in terms of performing their new assignments efficiently and effectively. The Peshawar High Court, Peshawar nominated twenty (20) newly promoted Additional District & Sessions Judges across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa to participate in the training. The course modules for this training were designed according to the job description and responsibilities of Additional District & District Judges. The key topics included: Judicial Ethics, Civil & Criminal Appeal, Revision, Management of Sessions Trial, Sentencing Guidelines, Appreciation of Evidence, Audio-Video Recording of Evidence and Maintenance of its records, Trials under special laws (theory and practice), Bail (Concept, Logic & Procedure), Justice of Peace (Section 25 CrPC), *Qisas, Diyat & Tazir*, and Judgment Writing. All the sessions were designed to be interactive and participatory.

- *To inculcate in them judicial decision making and judgment writing skills;*

3.2 ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES (OFF CAMPUS)

3.2.1 Regional Training for the Lawyers of District Bar Association, Mardan

At the request of the President and General Secretary of Bar Association, Mardan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy, in collaboration with District & Sessions Judge, Mardan, arranged one-day training for lawyers. Mr. Ghulam Abbass, DSJ/Senior Director (Research & Publications), Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy delivered extensive lectures on the overview of Civil Procedure Code, the recent amendments made in the CPC and its impact in juxtaposition to civil management rules and a detailed presentation was also made on filing of each proforma and time table thereof. The lectures were followed by group activity. The concluding ceremony was also attended by senior lawyers from district Mardan. The contribution on the part of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy being of first impression was highly appreciated by the lawyer.

3.3 ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES (ONLINE)

3.3.1 Third Online Training for Newly Promoted SCJs/Senior Most CJs

Mandatory training has its own significance for enhancing professionalism. For newly promoted Senior Civil Judges, the need for such training is even more paramount as the judicial officers assuming charge in this cadre are confronted with new and complicated human resource and financial management challenges.

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy conducted the first online post promotion training for the newly promoted Senior Civil Judges of batch 2018-19 from October 7 to October 31, 2020, followed by the second online post promotion training from December 4 to December 31, 2020, and third online post promotion training for these judges from 5th to 18th January 2021.

The training methodology was lecture-cum-participatory; renowned jurists gave intensive discourses on different subjects as per schedule. The officers of the Academy also shared their valuable experience. Considering the administrative assignments of the Senior Civil Judges, the discourses included Human Resource Management, Recruitments Procedures, APT Rules, Financial Management & Budgeting, Audits, office procedures, Conduct of various Committees, and Judicial Accounts. Every effort was made in order to sensitize the participants with all attributes attached with their office. Quality of the training was vividly gleaned from the resource person's evaluation by the participants.



3.3.2 Twelve One-Day Online Trainings on Civil Case Management Rules held between 1st January 2021 and 30th June 2021 for Civil Judges

The Courts of Civil Judges has an important role in the overall reflection and performance of the district judiciary. The Constitution of Pakistan guarantees speedy and in-expensive justice for all and sundry but unfortunately the civil justice system suffers from high cost of litigation, complexity, delay and frustration in lengthy trials, may be due to many reasons. It is not surprising that early identification of cases, settlement of issues, summary judgments and scheduling & conferencing of cases helps in resolving disputes expeditiously and in a timely manner as provided in the CPC Case Management Rules 2018. The CPC Case Management Rules 2018 not only provides a remedy against delay but also reduces the stress of the litigants and enhances the performance of the district judiciary. In compliance of the directions of the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy started a series of

online training courses on case management for civil judges from February 8, 2021 and onwards.

In the series of such activities, the Judicial Academy Peshawar conducted a training course in which thirty-two Civil Judges of the province participated in the subject course. The contents of this course included the conceptual explanation and importance of the pre-trial role of the judge. Mr. Ahmed Iftikhar, the then Director Instructions-II as resource person delivered an exhaustive online lecture on “Civil Case Management Rules”. In view of the rapidly changing scenario, the concepts of court and case management have gained prominence and if applied properly, it would not only enhance the capacity of the judicial officers in reducing the case backlog and restore the confidence of the general public in the justice sector. The resource person highlighted the link between the court and case management rules and the practical modes for applying the same. The training course will be highly beneficial for the participants to handle diverse cases with expertise by mastering the case and trials management techniques.

3.3.3 Eleven One-Day Online Trainings for AD&SJ's, SCJ's and CJ's/JM's on Criminal Trial with focus on Mental Illness and Forensic Health Assessment held between 1st January 2021 and 30th June 2021

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy started the online training program on criminal trials with special focus on mental illness and Forensic Health Assessment of mentally ill accused for the Civil Judges/JM's and Senior Civil Judges. The purpose of conducting the online training was to impart knowledge to the judges of the district judiciary about the principles of criminal prosecution of the accused claiming mental illness. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan in celebrated judgment reported as PLD 2021 SC 488 gave directions to hold the subject trainings for the justice sector personnel, in order to sensitize them about the principles of criminal prosecution of accused claiming mental illness at the time of commission of offense or afterwards during trial. On February 10, 2021, the landmark judgment was given in which three important questions in the criminal trial of the mentally ill accused were resolved:

1. *How should the trial Court deal with the plea of an accused that he/she was suffering from mental illness at the time of commission of offence?*
2. *How should the trial Court deal with the claim that due to mental illness, an accused is incapable of making his/her defence?*
3. *Whether a mentally ill condemned prisoner should be executed?*

Mr. Ashfaq Taj, the then Senior Director Administration gave 06 lectures on the subject to SCJ's & CJ's/JM's and Mr. Azhar Ali, Senior Director (Research & Publications) gave 05 training to the AD&SJs and highlighted that the purpose of conducting the online training program is to follow the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan that all the Provincial Judicial Academies including Federal Judicial Academy Islamabad shall arrange courses for trial court judges, prosecutors, lawyers and court staff on the mental illness, including forensic mental health assessment. 10 online trainings on the subject were imparted to

the Judicial Officers across the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa including Newly Merged Districts (NMDs) as tabled below:

3.3.4 02-Day Online Training on Effective Conduct of Government Litigation for District Attorneys

Aims & Objectives

- To develop skills for efficient use of substantive and procedural laws.
- Familiarize them with new relevant laws and recent amendments therein, practices, improvements, recent case law, and contemporary researches on the subject.
- Build their capacity for protecting the interest of the Government as per Law.

The common observation is that the government litigation suffers on account of the lack of interest of the personnel engaged by the Government to pursue litigation on its behalf. Such a casual approach hampers the administration of justice. For the proper management of the Government litigation, technically sound, efficient, and competent professionals are required. In this background, the role of District Attorneys attains immense significance. Considering the importance of their duties, the Academy arranged 02-day online training for District Attorneys across the Province on 7th and 8th July 2021.

Significance:

- To perform duties and functions effectively and efficiently.
- To know and understand substantive and procedural law for more productivity.
- Maintain an undamaging balance between the interests of individual citizens and interests of the Government.
- Be able to properly protect the interest of the Government as per Law.

3.3.5 Online Training Sessions on Criminal Trial with Focus on Mental Illness Including Forensic Health Assessment held between 1st July 2021 and 31st December 2021

The august Supreme Court of Pakistan, in a judgment reported as PLD 2021 SC 488, has been pleased to task the judicial academies to arrange courses for trial court judges, prosecutors, lawyers, and court staff to ensure that they understand the complexities of mental health and incarceration. In compliance, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy initiated training programs for judges, prosecutors, lawyers, and court staff on Criminal Trial with focus on mental health including forensic mental health assessment. In this respect, 16 online trainings on

the subject were imparted to the Judicial Officers as well as Lawyers across the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa including Newly Merged Districts (NMDs) as tabled below:

3.3.6 Online Training Sessions on Case Management and Scheduling Conference for Lawyers held between 1st July 2021 and 31st December 2021

CHAPTER -4 RESEARCH WING

4.1 Introduction

One of the aims and objectives of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy is to conduct research in the field of law and judicial studies besides, providing judicial education. The former Hon'ble Late Chairman believed that instead of pure academic research the matters of practical importance such as impediments in procedural laws in ensuring implementation of the decree/orders of the civil courts and the like research need to be focused after primary objective of skill development is achieved. The Research & Publications Wing conducted the following studies:

Research Studies

- Efficacy of judicial System in Malakand;
- Civil cases culminating to criminal cases - a baseline study in trends in crimes in Swat and Dir Upper Districts;
- Gaps between formal and informal justice system in Malakand;
- Research Study Evaluating functioning of Criminal Justice Coordination Committees in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa;
- The Rule of Law Reform and Judicial Education in Pakistan: Search for a Model;
- Standard Operating Procedures (SoPs) for Virtual Courts in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (draft for consideration by a high powered committee of Peshawar High Court); and
- Feasibility & Effectiveness of Release Warrant of Prisoners through Electronic Modes.

These studies/researches were mostly quantitative.

- Judging Juvenility: Determination of Age of Juvenile Offenders under Pakistan's Juvenile Justice System

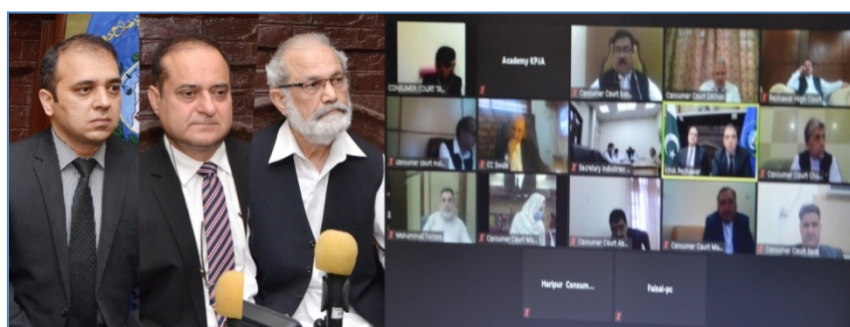
4.2 Advice on Legislative Proposals

6. The Constitution (Amendment) Bill- 2021.
7. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Prohibition of Corporal Punishment Bill, 2021.

4.3 Consultative Webinar on finalization of the Draft Rules, 2020 under the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Consumer Protection Act, 1997


The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy has also undertaken the role and shared the responsibilities of the law and rule making. The subject webinar was arranged by Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy online on 07th April, 2021. Mr. Ashfaq Taj, the then Sr. Director (Admn) and Mr. Ghulam Abbas, the then Sr. Director (Research and Publication) were the moderators of the webinar. They highlighted the aims and objectives and explained the purpose of holding the webinar. The participants of the webinar were the learned Judges of Consumer Protection Courts, Special Secretary Industries & Labour Department and representative of Law, Parliamentary Affairs & Human Rights Department. The main agenda of the webinar was to finalize the draft rules, 2020 under the Consumer Protection Act, 1997

It is a known fact that Pakistan has been hosting a large number of Afghan Refugees since 1979. The crucial issues involved in the Afghan Refugees crisis had been the violation of human rights laws, child protection, and the legal status of Afghan Refugees in Pakistan. The various other core issues include but are not limited to fragile economic conditions, access to social services such as health, education, restricted mobility, inadequate livelihood opportunities, access to the

formal justice system, etc. In the wake of the current political scenario in Afghanistan in particular and its turbulent history, in general, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy in collaboration with SHARP Pakistan and UNHCR arranged a 01-day Consultative Session for Judicial Officers and other stakeholders on Human Rights, Refugee Rights, and the legal status of Afghan Refugees in Pakistan on 8th November 2021. The subject session also covered basic concepts of International Human Rights Law, the International Refugee Law, and contemporary issues related to Child Protection. The expert resource persons and the participants discussed the challenges faced by the refugees in an interactive session. The session also included a consultative approach through PowerPoint presentations, group discussions, and group activities.

4.5 Publication of Bench Book

The first edition of the Bench Book for District Judiciary was published in 2016. The second edition stands revised to accommodate the latest case law, amendments, and procedural changes made during 2016-2021.

The following amendments as initiated by law have been fully incorporated properly where so required as per details below:

- The Constitution (Eighteenth Amendment) Act No. X of 2010.
- The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Child Protection and Welfare Act, 2010.
- The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Mental Health Act, 2017.
- The Juvenile Justice System Act, 2018.
- The Code of Criminal Procedure (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa)(Amendment) Act, 2019 (Act No. XLI of 2019).
- The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Alternate Dispute Resolution Act, 2020.
- The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Code of Civil Procedure (Amendment) Act, 2020 (Act No. XLIX of 2020).
- The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Domestic Violence Act, 2021.

It merits mention that the revised Bench Book is a handy guide for the judicial officers who on each occasion have to consult much bulky material for reaching the relevant law. This effort on their part consumes a lot of time and causes delay in disposal of judicial business. With handy reference a lot of time of court shall be saved and it shall also aid to better and timely service delivery. It is hoped, that this edition will, too, prove more useful for the Bench & the Bar. The revised Bench Book is available at the official website of the Academy.

4.6 Publication of Newsletter

The aim and objective of the Academy is to provide judicial education not only through training courses (both physical & online) but also through the publication of journals and reports in terms of Section 4 (a) & (d) of the Act. The Academy, being a public sector organization, presents its performance as a statutory responsibility in the form of an annual report, e-bulletin, newsletters, etc. The Academy initiated its quarterly e-bulletin in January 2014 followed by various monthly as well as quarterly e-bulletins and first bi-annual newsletter i.e. January-June 2020. Now in 2021, the Research & Publication Wing has compiled second & third bi-annual newsletters. These cover overall curricular, extra-curricular, and other capacity-building activities carried out by the Academy during the year 2021, which reveals how this institution utilizes the resources and whether the efforts of the Academy are in the right direction towards the achievements of the objectives for which this Academy has been established.

4.7 Analysis of the Research Papers authored by Judicial Officers

Hon'ble the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, in the light of its policy decision vide circular letter Endst:No. SDJ/PHC/REG/26-V.II-(1-3)/5522 dated 07-10-2019 regarding cultivation of culture of Research at the level of District Judiciary, instructed the District & Sessions Judges to assign different topics concerning Administration of Justice to the Judicial Officers for preparation, presentation, as well as writing of Research Papers. The presentations and papers, so submitted are to be circulated amongst all the judicial officers at the station, who in return shall formulate at least five critical questions on the topics for discussion in their monthly meeting. The presentation and research papers along with questions of the judicial officers are to be recorded and their copy sent to the Hon'ble High Court. Likewise, a copy thereof is to be sent to the Academy for 'Research Analysis'. In this background, Hon'ble the Chairman approved the following Research Committee:

Under the directive of Hon'ble the Chairman, Dr. Khurshid Iqbal, District & Sessions Judge, who is expert in the field of Research and Academic Writing, has been co-opted as a member.

The research papers/articles so scribed by learned Judicial Officers are being received for research analysis. The Research Wing is analyzing/scrutinizing the work/writings in accordance with the prescribed SOPs. The research papers approved by the committee will be published on the Academy's website and in the journal. Preparatory arrangements for publication of the Journal are under process.

4.8 Library, Collection, Development, and Enhancement

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy has a state-of-the-art library. The library catalogue is enriched with 3500 books, periodicals, journals, research studies and other reading materials on Law, Literature, History, and Islamic Shariah. The reading room and collections are available to the faculty members, participants of training courses, employees of the Academy, and researchers, among others, during regular library hours. Library staff is at service of the participants/learners. The library has access to Digital Library of HEC, PLD law-site and PLJ journals. Fifty (50) journals links are also available on the Academy's website, and through such sources more than 5000 books can be accessed. In the year 2021, some new subscription and purchases were also made.

CHAPTER -5 INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY

5.1 IT Facilities & its Utilization in the Academy

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy is equipped with state-of-the-art Information Technology (IT) infrastructure. All the offices, class rooms, auditorium and computer lab are connected with local area network (LAN). Wi-Fi facility is also available in the Academy to facilitate the trainee participants and it provides open access to all. The Academy has its official website which is regularly maintained, updated and improved through the official web developer of the Academy. The catalogue of the library is automated and its software is indigenously programmed at the Academy. This catalogue is uploaded to the website and is accessible to the general public. Similarly, an asset tracking system has also been designed and programmed by the Academy's programmer. It keeps track of all movable assets of the Academy and it is updated through barcode readers. The IT wing has also developed a prototype of training database called the activity management system (AMS) with separate module meant for evaluation. It regularly updates the training profiles of both trainers and trainees. This system works on online evaluation through randomly sorted multiple choice questions. Through this module, both the trainees and the trainers can be objectively evaluated. The IT wing has also designed payroll software, which is operative at the elementary level.

CHAPTER -6 RADIO MEEZAN FM 96.6

The role of media in information sharing is growing spectacularly with recognition of the right to information and fundamental rights enshrined in the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973. Among the mass media in recent time, role of FM radio is undeniable. The FM radio provides easy, inexpensive and frequent accessibility to the media, which raises the level of public expectations. The public has right to know about such information from key public sector institutions, which has an impact on their lives. As a non-commercial non-political facility, Radio Meezan operates under the PEMRA Rules. The transmission frequency allotted to the Radio is FM 96.6. The coverage of the Radio is presently extended to district Peshawar and the adjacent areas. It shall be extended to the whole province of Khyber Pukhtunkhwa in due course of time.

Objectives of Radio Meezan

- Awareness among citizens about fundamental human rights.
- Awareness among citizens about their rights and responsibilities in the existing system of law.
- Awareness about rights of children, and minorities, women and weaker segments of society.
- Encouraging access to Human Rights Cell of the Peshawar High Court.
- Public forum to seek legal advice on solution of disputes.
- Acquainting citizens with the laws, rules and regulations of the country.
- Educate and interpret public about the country's legal system.

6.1 Programs Format

News Bulletins

Radio Meezan broadcasts news bulletins of 10 minutes in Pashto and Urdu.

News reports

It consists of the news about courts proceedings, human rights issues, functions of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy, International days e.g. Labor Day, Women Day etc.

News Packages

The news packages include law and courts related stories, seminars, workshops, trainings, visits, inaugurations and reports of the academic activities of the Academy.

Broadcast Timing

08:00 am to 11:00 am
03:00 pm to 07:00 pm

Discussion/ Lecture Forum

At various discussion forums, lectures are delivered by renowned lawyers, jurists and constitutional experts on law related topics.

Live Presentation

Interacting with audience on law related issues, phone lines are open during such programs, where audience can not only give their input but can also seek legal advice of the legal expert on the subject.

Coverage

The Transmission on Radio Meezan FM 96.6 can be heard in Peshawar and its suburbs. Radio Meezan operates its transmission on 50 Watt, as per PEMRA rules and license.

6.2 Miscellaneous Program Segments

- Imparting general knowledge about the legal system of Pakistan;
- Interesting historical moments about law;
- Quizzes about legal systems;
- Socio-cultural and economic activities.

CHAPTER-7 DEVELOPMENT SECTOR

7.1 Maintenance and Repair (M&R) Works

In pursuance of the decision taken by the Board of Governors on 12th June 2020 in its 11th meeting, PC-I drawn up by the C&W Department was approved by the DDWP headed by the Registrar, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar on 3rd November 2020. Accordingly, Administrative Approval was granted by the Competent Authority on 14th November 2020. To implement the decision, C&W Department invited tenders, awarded the contract after technical sanction regarding the execution of the work. An amount of Rs 4.00 million sanctioned by the Finance Committee of the Academy was transferred to the C&W department for M&R work. Around 80% of the work has been carried out. However, the exact quantity & quality of work done will be measured, checked, and reported by the C&W Department. A satisfactory work completion will be required to be issued by the Academy only after a thorough inspection and clearance report by the C&W Department.

7.2 Acquisition of 150-Kanal land in Regi Model Town, Peshawar

The Peshawar Development Authority had approved allotment of 150-Kanal land for the construction of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy at Regi Model Town, Peshawar @ Rs 2,500,000/- per Kanal vide letter No. 3.01.77/47/10 dated 22/05/2012. A sum of Rs 400.00 million was reflected in ADP for the subject scheme for the year 2015-16.

However, In the meeting of the PDWP held on 15th September 2017 in the P&D Department under the chairmanship of the Additional Chief Secretary, the following decisions were made:

- The project was approved at the reduced cost of Rs 290.00 million.
- Instead of 150 Kanals, only 95 Kanals were allowed.
- The possession charges were deleted from PC-I

In light of the minutes of the meeting, an Administrative Approval was issued for Rs 290.00 million by the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar. The same stands reflected in the ADP Scheme.

Subsequently, in compliance with the decision of Board of Governors (BoG) taken in its 9th meeting held on 22nd April 2019, afresh summary was moved to the Provincial Government for increasing the area of land from 95-Kanal to 150-Kanal, which was duly approved by the Chief Minister, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The Peshawar Development Authority Board, in pursuance of the approval of the Chief Minister, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, approved the allotment of 150-Kanal land for the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy at Regi Model Town, Peshawar at the following rates:-

The Secretary to Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Communication & Works Department, Peshawar has been requested that the PC-I/Detail Cost Estimates may please be suitably revised as to cost of land and other matters incidental or ancillary thereto so that the same is placed before PDWP for consideration and approval.

7.3 Hostel Gymnasium

By the grace of Al-Mighty Allah (subhan-wa-ta'alah), furnishing of hostel of the Academy was finally completed. Installation of the Air Conditioners & CCTV and landscaping has been completed. Procurement of the furniture and other equipment has also been completed. The Gym articles, however, have been provided to the hostel by the Government of KP, Sports and Culture Department out of its own ADP scheme. It is expected that the building will be handed over to the Academy and made functional in the near future.

8.2 Additional Accounts

- In pursuance of recommendations inked by the Finance Committee of the Academy held on 23.02.2021 and after approval by the Board of Governors of the Academy in the 12th meeting held on 28.06.2021, Finance Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa agreed to allocate funds amounting **Rs. 114.000 million** as **grant-in-aid** for the current financial year 2021-22.
- During 2021, a sum of **Rs. 1,314,524/-** was earned from trainings, workshops and seminars. After approval of Hon'ble the Chief Justice, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar/Chairman, the earning along with some of the balance of **Rs. 4,309,635/-** was transferred to Endowment Fund in March, 2021 for strengthening the same.
- A profit of **Rs. 13,090,000/-** is expected from the investment made by the Academy towards Endowment Fund kept in Bank of Khyber, Peshawar High Court Branch, Peshawar.

CHAPTER -9 VISITS & EVENTS

9.1 Oath Taking Ceremony of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Qaiser Rashid Khan

On January 09, 2021, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Qaiser Rashid Khan took the oath as the Chief Justice, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar. Governor Khyber Pakhtunkhwa administered oath to the Chief Justice at Governor House, Peshawar. Chief Minister Mahmood Khan, Hon'ble judges of Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, District Judiciary and other government functionaries attended the oath-taking ceremony.

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy Peshawar is a body corporate. The management of its affairs vests in the Board of Governors (BoG) with Hon'ble the Chief Justice, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar as its Chairman.



9.2 The Signing of MoU between the UN Women Pakistan and Academy

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy has always invited all the stake holders, the non-government organizations etc to share and participate in the capacity building of the justice sector. On 20-05-2021, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy and UN Women Pakistan signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to promote rule of law and to make the judicial system accessible and gender responsive. The MOU was signed by Mr. Zia-ud-Din Khattak, Director General of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy and Ms. Sharmeela Rasool, Representative of UN Women Pakistan. The aim of the MOU is to foment partnership in promoting gender equality & women empowerment (GEWE), and support platforms to ensure

that the justice sector stakeholders are gender sensitized in their approach when dealing with women survivors of violence in light of national/provincial policies and international best practices.



9.3 Visit of Hon'ble the Chief Justice, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar

On June 15, 2021, at 1:50 PM, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Qaiser Rashid Khan, Chief Justice, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar /Chairman Board of Governors, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy, graced the Academy with his lordship's visit. The Director General and Faculty of the Academy welcomed his lordship.

The Director General apprised his lordship about the ongoing activities and trainings at the Academy and also shared the Annual Judicial Training Calendar 2021. A presentation was also made via multimedia showing training modules and the prevalent Pre and Post Training Evaluation criteria. Likewise, the Director General shared the directives of Hon'ble the Chairman regarding the principles of self- accountability, honesty, integrity, character building, and earning livelihood through Halal means having already been incorporated in the uniform module drawn up by the Academy for local/regional training of District Judiciary. Hon'ble the Chairman was appreciative of the activities successfully carried out in the Academy.

Hon'ble the Chairman visited the Library, Research Wing, and other sections of Academy and informally interacted with the faculty and the staff.

9.4 Visit of the Hon'ble Judges of the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar

On June 17, 2021, at 10:30 AM, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Lal Jan Khattak (Senior Judge Peshawar High Court, Peshawar/member Administrative Committee, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar) and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ijaz Anwar Khan, Judge Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, graced the Academy with their visit. The Director General and Faculty of the Academy welcomed the Hon'ble Judges.

The Director General briefed their lordships about the establishment of the Academy, its organizational structure, ongoing activities, and recently undertaken trainings. 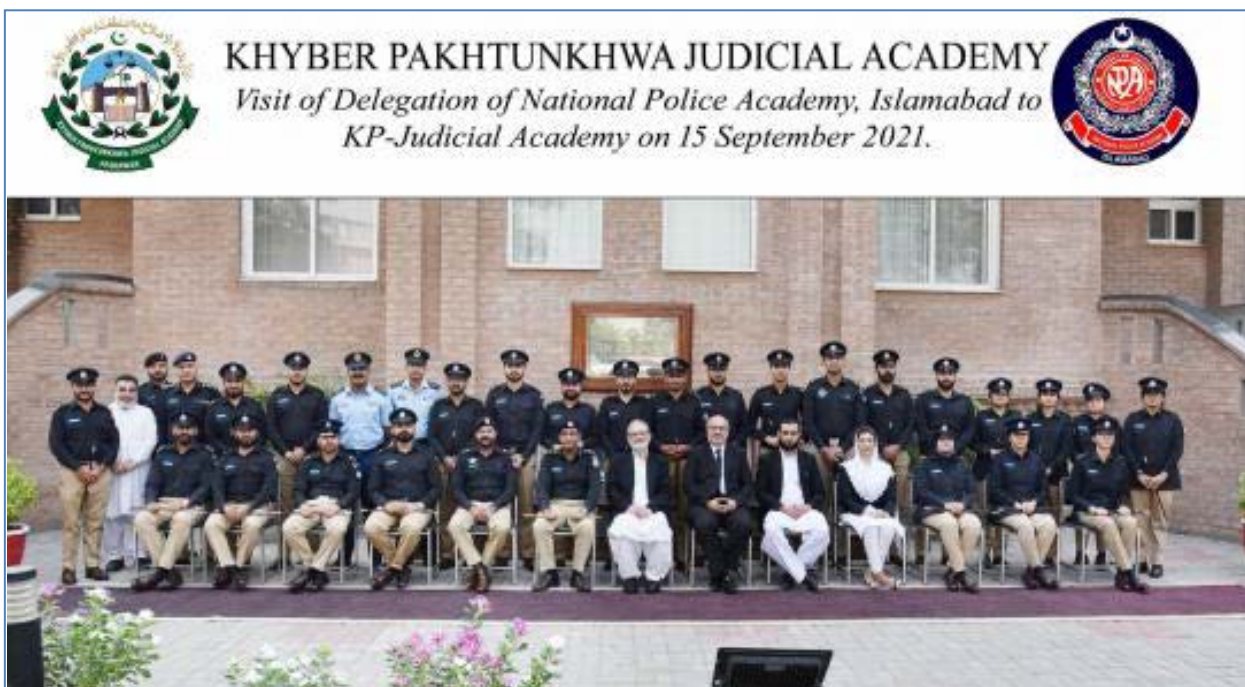
9.5 Visit of the 62nd Islamic Law Course Trainees and Faculty Members of Shari'ah Academy, IIU Islamabad
