EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy (KPJA), in collaboration with the District Judiciary Swat and Bar Associations of Swat, Buner, and Shangla, successfully conducted a four-day “Professional Development Course for Young Lawyers” from 23rd to 26th June, 2025 at the Regional Headquarters Swat. The training was attended by over 115 newly enrolled lawyers and aimed to enhance their legal knowledge, ethical grounding, courtroom skills, and advocacy techniques.

The training curriculum was designed to bridge the gap between academic knowledge and practical legal application, equipping participants with essential competencies in legal research, drafting, trial advocacy, procedural law, and professional responsibility. The interactive sessions emphasized continuing legal education (CLE), as endorsed by the Supreme Court of Pakistan, and provided a platform for young lawyers to develop their legal acumen and confidence in litigation. The four-day course included expert-led sessions on civil and criminal law, family law, legal drafting, legal ethics, evidence appreciation, case management, pre-trial procedures, and Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR). A special focus was placed on gender-based challenges in the legal profession, encouraging female lawyers to aspire for leadership roles, including judicial positions.

Structured as an interactive and participatory learning program, the training combined lectures, discussions, and case studies facilitated by senior judges, seasoned advocates, and legal scholars. This approach ensured maximum engagement and knowledge retention, fostering a strong professional foundation for the participating lawyers.

This report provides a comprehensive overview of the training, starting with an executive summary. The introduction and objectives highlight the significance of the program, while the proceedings section provides a day-by-day account of the sessions. The conclusion summarizes key takeaways, and the annexure includes the list of participants, the training schedule, and photographs from the event.

INTRODUCTION

The august Supreme Court of Pakistan, in its reported judgments^{1,2,3} emphasized the necessity of Bar vocational training as a regular feature of legal education. These landmark judgments highlighted the importance of equipping lawyers with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively serve their clients and society at large. The Court recognized that the challenges faced by the legal profession require a robust training framework that addresses professional competencies within the legal context.

A strong and efficient legal profession is vital for promoting the rule of law and ensuring that citizens have unimpeded access to justice. It is only possible when there is proper education not only at the academic and professional stages comprising of institutional and practical trainings but also continuing legal education.

The august Supreme Court of Pakistan observed that:

Once young professionals are admitted to the Bar, it is necessary that they continue to evolve, learn and improve their skills and knowledge to maintain consistency with a progressing legal environment. As a matter of fact, some foreign jurisdictions require mandatory / minimum Continuing Legal Education (CLE) or Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for lawyers and attorneys to undertake after they are admitted to the Bar. This continuing education requirement ensures that lawyers keep abreast with the development in law and jurisprudence, maintain professional ethical standards and enhance the quality and caliber of the practice of law.⁴

Similarly, highlighting the importance of continuing professional education, the supreme court of Canada also held that:

“A lawyer’s professional education is lifelong process. Legislation is amended, the common law evolves and practice standards change as a result of technological advances and other developments”. Lawyers must be vigilant in order to update their knowledge, strengthen their skills and ensure that they adhere to accepted ethical and professional standards in their practices.⁵

In Pakistan, young legal professionals encounter significant challenges as they navigate a highly competitive environment. Despite possessing academic qualifications, many new entrants to the legal profession struggle to translate their theoretical knowledge into practical application. Essential skills such as legal ethics, professional responsibility, and advocacy techniques are crucial for becoming a successful lawyer. Unfortunately, these skills are often not emphasized in academic programs and at the professional stage, leaving young professionals ill-prepared for the demands of the profession.

Investing in the training and development of young lawyers is investing in the future of justice. (International Bar Association)

Effective training and continuous improvement in legal skills, particularly for young lawyers, are essential for upholding legal values and ethical standards. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy is particularly attuned to the challenges faced by young lawyers as they join and compete in the legal profession. Since 2016, the KPJA has been conducting trainings for young lawyers, particularly in areas such as advocacy, legal research, and interpretation of the law, to enhance their professional development. Continuous professional development programs are essential for maintaining high standards of legal practice and upholding ethical conduct, both of which are fundamental to a functioning judicial system.

This training aimed to be a capacity-building initiative focused on enhancing the professional skills of a large number of young lawyers in a single activity, ensuring they are well-equipped to uphold the rule of law and effectively serve the justice system.

TRAINING METHODOLOGY/ IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

The training was conducted by the KP Judicial Academy, through Regional Outreach instead of on-campus. Such training sessions will be organized in various regional/divisional headquarters to facilitate participation from young lawyers across the province with maximum number of the participants. This approach will not only enhance accessibility but also be cost-effective. It was conducted in collaboration with KP Bar Council and Local Bar Association's to promote the training programs and encourage participation by their members.

The training was carried out with interactive and participatory approach, incorporating a blend of presentations, discussions, and questions & answers. The facilitators led presentations on key topics, and the participants were encouraged to share their perspectives and experiences.

NOMINATION CRITERIA:

The criteria for nominations were to ensure a more structured and inclusive process for aspiring young lawyers within the divisions. Nominations were solicited through the Sessions Judges of the districts. This process also involved consultation with the Presidents of the Bar Associations and members of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Bar Council. By implementing this criterion of a collaborative approach, a more transparent and equitable nomination process can be ensured to provide opportunity to aspirant young lawyers for strengthening the legal profession as a whole.

OBJECTIVES

- To provide lawyers with advanced training in legal practices, ethics, and emerging areas of law, ensuring they meet both national and international standards.
- To integrate gender perspectives into legal training, fostering an inclusive environment that empowers both male and female lawyers.
- To conduct training sessions at various regional headquarters, ensuring maximum participation from young lawyers.
- Improve participants' understanding of key legal principles and concepts relevant to their practice.
- Develop participants' skills in legal research, analysis, and writing.
- Equip participants with practical advocacy and litigation skills.
- Foster a strong ethical foundation and professional responsibility.
- Build confidence and self-esteem in young lawyers.
- Provide mentorship and networking opportunities to facilitate career advancement.
- Encourage lawyers particularly females for judiciary as profession.
- Address gender-specific challenges faced by women in the legal profession.
- Promote Gender Parity in the Legal Profession
- Create a more inclusive and equitable legal environment.
- Strengthen the Legal Profession in Pakistan.
- Contribute to the development of a competent and ethical legal profession.
- Improve the quality of legal services provided to the public.
- Foster a culture of continuous learning and professional development.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

- Young lawyers will gain a stronger sense of responsibility towards their clients, the legal profession, and society.
- Participants will develop both technical skills and the right professional mindset needed for effective legal practice.

A deeper understanding and application of legal ethics will lead to more ethical and responsible legal practice.

Concluding Ceremony

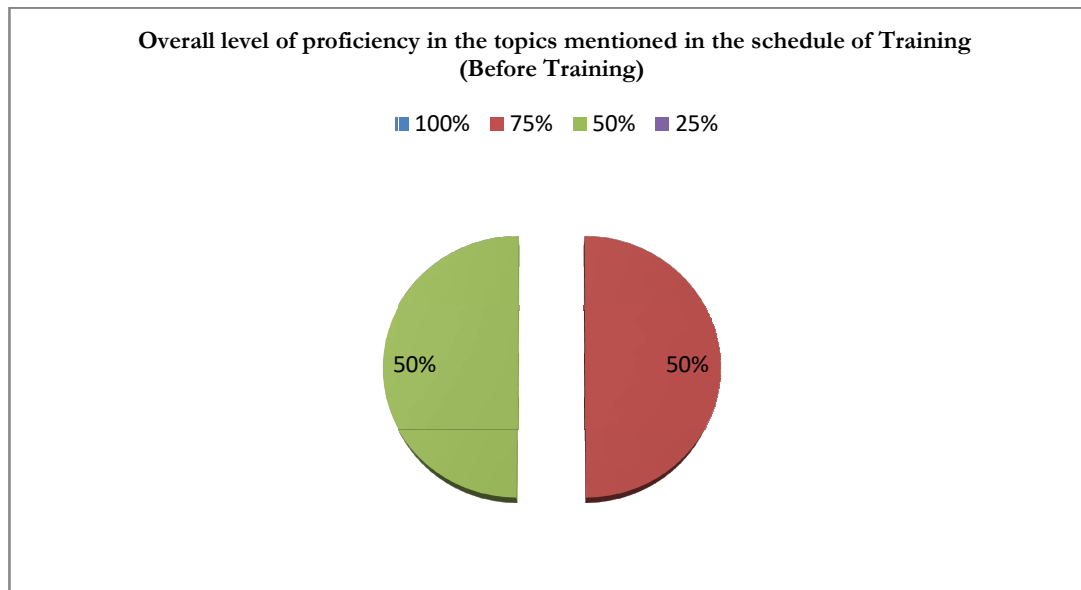

Pre- & post-evaluation questionnaires were designed to cater for this aspect. Relevant feedback obtained from the participants is reflected below:

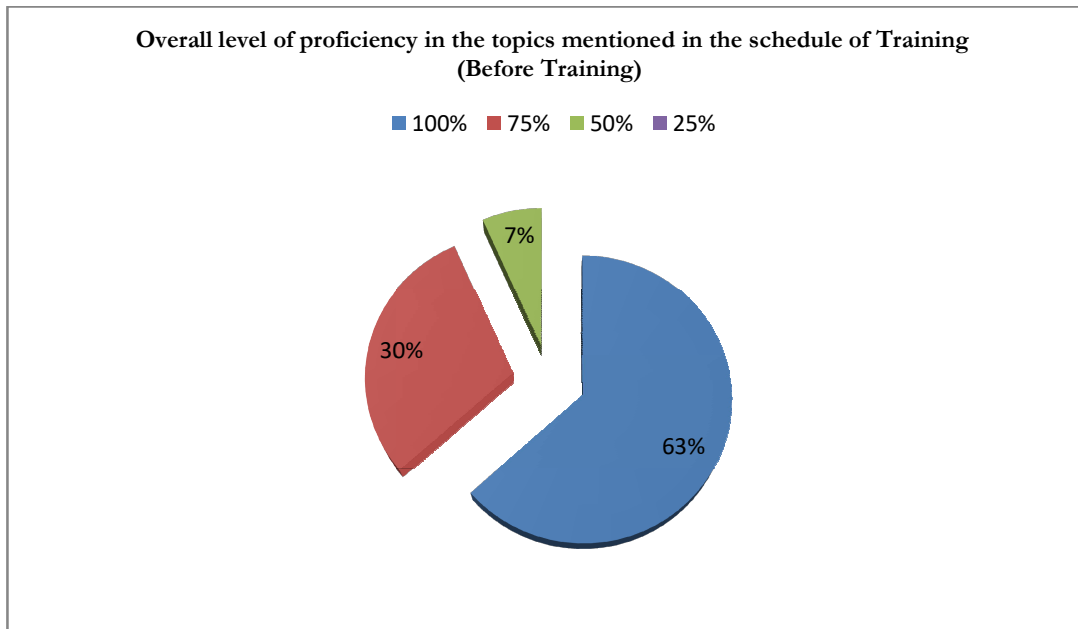


Interpretation:

The above pie chart represents the level of trainee's proficiency in the topics of the training schedule before the commencement of the subject training:

	Represents 25% level of proficiency- indicated by 00% of the trainees.
	Represents 50% level of proficiency- indicated by 50% of the trainees.
	Represents 75% level of proficiency- indicated by 50% of the trainees.
	Represents 100% level of proficiency- indicated by 00% of the trainees.

Quality of the training can be assessed by participants' evaluation of the resource persons. Moreover, the participants were asked to comment on the overall quality of the program. Their response and the feedback are shown in graphic form below:



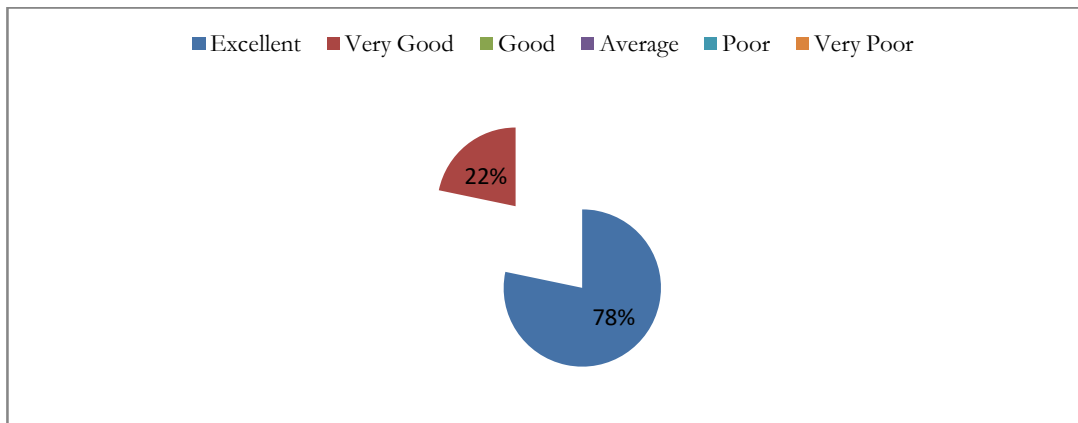
Interpretation:

The above pie chart represents the level of trainee's proficiency in the topics of the training schedule after the conclusion of the subject training:

- Represents 50% level of proficiency- indicated by 70% of the trainees.
- Represents 75% level of proficiency- indicated by 30% of the trainees.
- Represents 100% level of proficiency- indicated by 63% of the trainees.

The pre and post evaluation shows significant improvement in the level of proficiency from 0% to 63%.

QUALITY OF THE TRAINING



- 22% of the trainees rated the overall quality of the training program to be very good
- 78% of the trainees rated the overall quality of the training program to be excellent

FEEDBACK

During the four-day training, participants shared valuable insights regarding the training's effectiveness, structure, and areas for improvement. Their feedback has been summarized below:

Training Structure & Methods

- Many participants found the training well-organized and informative, with no need for significant changes.
- A few trainees suggested removing tea breaks and using the time to extend lecture sessions for better engagement.
- Several participants praised the overall training quality, stating that it was well-planned and aligned with their professional needs.

Future Improvements

- The inclusion of more interactive and practical exercises was recommended to make the training more engaging and skill-focused.
- Some participants requested that similar training programs be conducted in their respective cities for greater accessibility.

Overall, the training was well-received, with participants acknowledging its value in enhancing their legal knowledge and professional competencies. The feedback provided will help in refining future training programs to better cater to the needs of young lawyers.

CONCLUSION

The Four-Day Professional Development Course for Young Lawyers concluded successfully on June 26, 2025, with active participation from over 115 young legal professionals across Swat, Buner, and Shangla.

The training provided a well-rounded experience combining ethical foundations, procedural clarity, practical courtroom skills, and contemporary legal issues, including gender justice and juvenile protection.
