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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy (KPJA) conducted a series of one-day training sessions as part of the "Justice Sector Reforms: Capacity Uplift of Paralegals" program from 3rd to 7th of September 2024. The training targeted key paralegal groups, including petition writers, oath commissioners, notary publics, and stamp vendors, to enhance their professionalism, ethical practices, and legal knowledge, ensuring more efficient and accountable service delivery within the justice system.

This report provides a comprehensive overview of the training sessions, structured as follows: The introduction & background outlines the need for capacity building in the paralegal sector. The Methodology explains the interactive and participatory nature of the sessions. The key components of the training program describe the core topics covered, including ethics, professional conduct, and record maintenance. The objective of the program and the expected outcomes highlight the goals of fostering professionalism and improving public trust in the justice system.

The proceedings were divided into three sections detailing each of the training sessions held on the 3rd, 5th, and 7th of September for petition writers, oath commissioners & notary publics, and stamp vendors, respectively. The conclusion summarizes the program's impact, while the Annexure provide additional details such as the list of participants, the training schedule, and photographs from the sessions. This report serves as a detailed account of the training program and its contribution to improving the performance and efficiency of paralegals in the justice sector.

## INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND

The rule of law is durable system of laws, institutions, norms and community commitments that delivers four universal principles: accountability, laws open governments, and accessible & impartial justice. An efficient and effective justice regime not only benefits individuals but also contributes significantly to the broader economic stability of a nation. Within this framework, every State institution has a critical role to play, and it is essential to strengthen these institutions to uphold the rule of law. The Constitution of Pakistan mandates the provision of expeditious, affordable, and accessible justice for all citizens. However, the litigation process often commences outside the formal court system, involving a network of paralegal services provided by petition writers, stamp vendors, oath commissioners, and notary public. The effectiveness of justice delivery is intrinsically linked to the competence and professionalism of these paralegals. Operating within the courts, they facilitate access to justice by providing essential legal services, including drafting legal documents, verifying the authenticity of documents, and administering oaths. Despite their critical role, these professionals often face challenges, such as a lack of formal training, limited access to legal updates, and navigating complex legal and bureaucratic processes. Concerns have been raised regarding the lack of consistency in their fees, deficiencies in their knowledge of relevant laws and procedures, and inefficiencies in their operations. Moreover, the regulatory framework governing their activities is outdated and fails to meet contemporary needs.

In response to these challenges, the Peshawar High Court has developed a comprehensive strategy aimed at the standardization, regulation, and capacity building of paralegals. This initiative is designed to enhance the efficiency and accessibility of the justice delivery system, ultimately benefiting litigants and reinforcing the rule of law in Pakistan.

## METHODOLOGY

This training was part of a comprehensive program divided into four phases. The first two phases—identifying problems and needs through monitoring, and conducting a consultative workshop—have already been completed. Following the consultative session, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy developed the paralegal training based on the recommendations from all stakeholders involved and the areas of concern highlighted by District & Sessions Judges in their inspection reports. The training activities were specifically designed to address the skill gaps and needs identified during these earlier phases. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Judicial Academy, through this training, aimed to prepare paralegals for their responsibilities and the

challenges they face and to equip them with the necessary skills and knowledge. This training aligns with the Academy's mandate to provide training to stakeholders in the justice system and to uphold the rule of law.

## KEY COMPONENTS OF THE TRAINING PROGRAM

The course module aimed to cover these topics:

### 1. Ethics and Professional Conduct

- **Objective:** Reinforce the importance of ethical behaviour and adherence to professional standards.
- **Content:**
  - Review of ethical standards relevant to petition writers, stamp vendors, oath commissioners, and notary public.
  - Discussion of real-life ethical dilemmas and appropriate responses.
  - Strategies for maintaining professionalism in challenging situations

### 2. Understanding Legal Procedures and Updates

- **Objective:** Provide a comprehensive understanding of relevant legal procedures and recent legal developments.
- **Content:**
  - Overview of key legal procedures related to petition writing, stamp vendors, oath commissioners and notary public

### 3. Maintenance of record and Documentation

- **Objective:** Enhance the ability of paralegals
- **Content:**
  - Best practices and techniques
  - Procedures to be followed
  - Identifying common errors and challenges in documentation and how to avoid them

## OBJECTIVE OF THE PROGRAM

The primary objective was to reaffirm public faith in the justice system. The program would serve the following specific objectives:

- A stronger commitment to ethical practices and professional conduct
- Updated legal knowledge and comprehending relevant laws, rules and procedures;
- Refining the professional skills of the paralegal for effective and efficient delivery of service;
- Demonstrate improved service delivery skills in their interaction with other justice sector stakeholders;

## EXPECTED OUTCOME

The program undertakes a comprehensive review into the institutions of the paralegals and would develop mechanisms to facilitate its modernization so that it is better able to meet the current and future needs. The expected outcome was the structural reforms of the institutions of petition writers, oath commissioners, stamp vendors and notary public which would ultimately improve the litigant's access to justice. After structural improvements the institution of the paralegals would be more efficient, accessible, accountable, fair and able to deliver timely results in a cost-effective manner.
